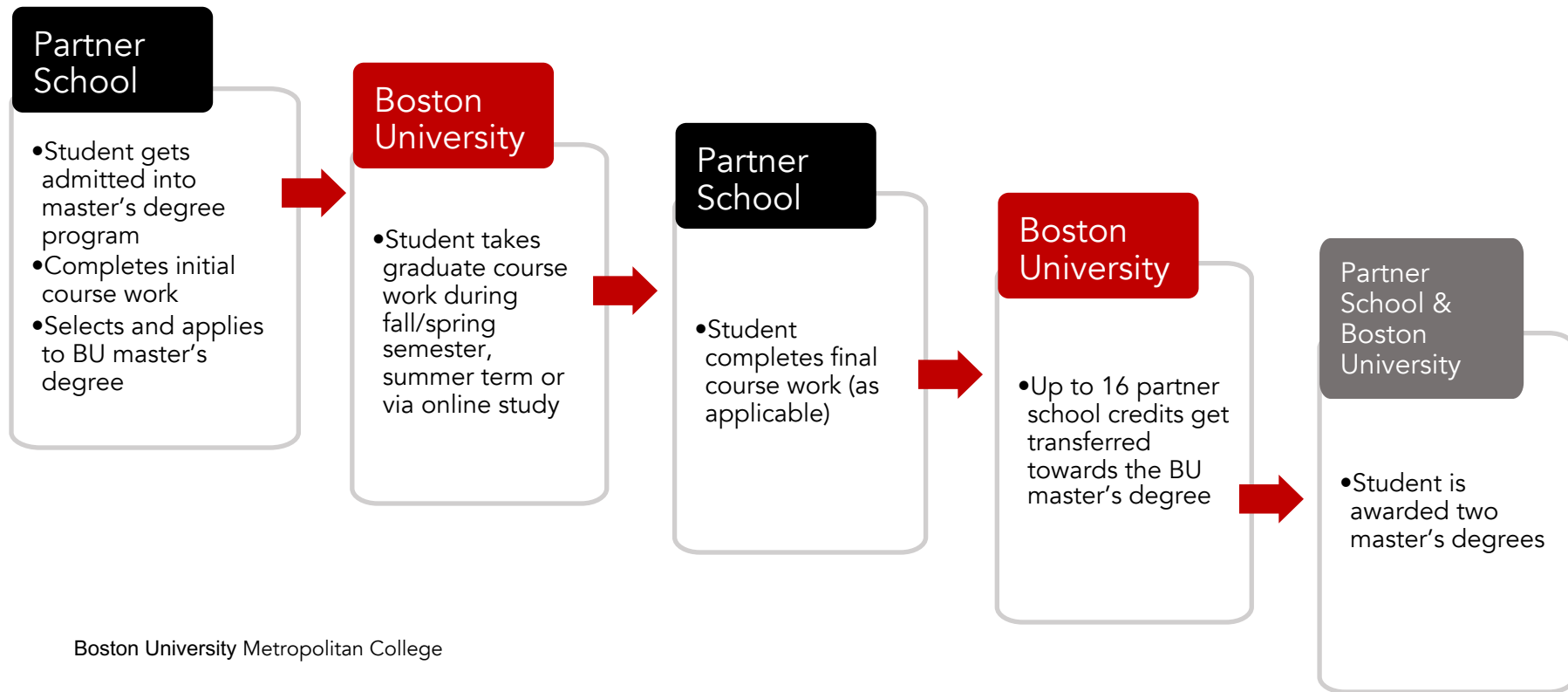

SECOND MASTER'S GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAM MAP

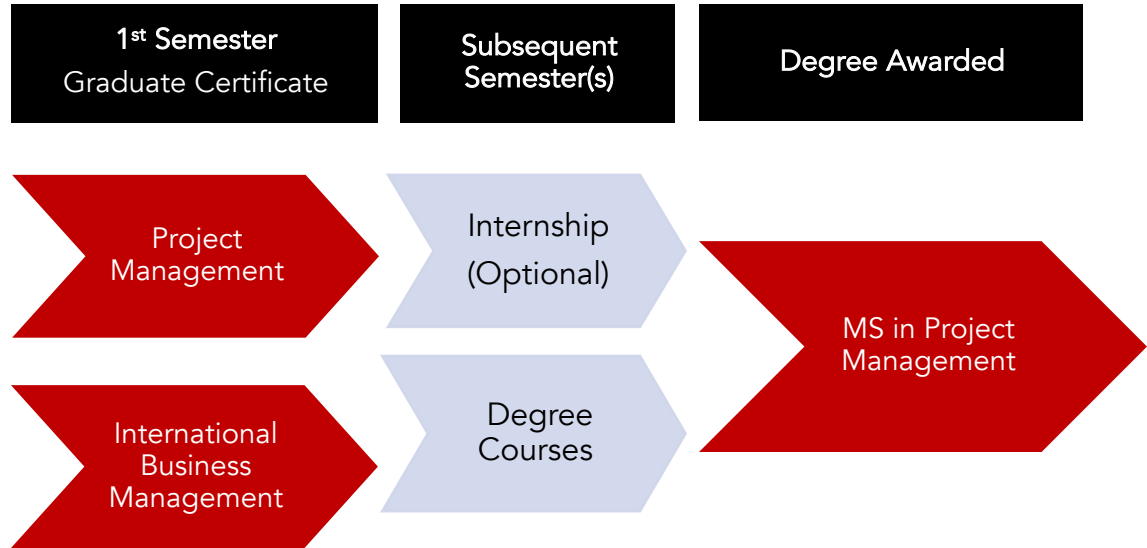

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PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCES

Curricular Practical Training (CPT)

- 4 credit internship option for students pursuing on-campus Administrative Sciences master's degree
- Full-time, semester-long internship placements in Boston

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

1

International Office at home institution provides MET International with a list of nominated students.

2

Nominated students apply and upload application materials via BU's Web-Admit application portal.

3

MET International & BU academic department review application materials and MET International distributes admission decisions.

4

Admitted students receive I-20 from MET International, which allows student to apply for an F1 visa at U.S. consulate or embassy.

5

Admitted students must attend mandatory orientation activities.
