DESCRIPTION

The research training program focuses on **large-scale and composite cultural natural heritage areas** by identifying and interpreting long-lasting **human/historic environment interactions** and surveying their potential as drivers for fostering community resilience and by investigating **intangible values and local knowledge** in historic environments.

Integrating social sciences and digital technologies and their practical and theoretical inputs, bottom-up processes will be tackled in real international cases by engaging representatives of local communities to co-investigate heritage-driven community resilience with a **holistic heritage-led approach** to large-scale historic areas at risk.
