Rector's decree no. 66 dated 11<sup>th</sup> February 2019

**THE RECTOR**

Having regard to the University Statute;

Having regard to the University Teaching Regulations;

Having regard to Law no. 189 dated 30<sup>th</sup> July 2002, concerning "Changes to legislation on immigration and asylum";

Having regard to Ministerial decree no. 270 dated 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2004, "Amendments to the Regulations on university educational autonomy";

Having regard to Ministerial decrees dated 16<sup>th</sup> March 2007, "Determination of degree classes" and "Determination of the single-cycle Master's degree classes";

Having regard to Ministerial decree no. 47 dated 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2013;

- Having regard to Law no. 104 dated 5<sup>th</sup> February 1992, "Framework law on care, social integration and rights of persons with disabilities" and subsequent amendments, and in particular article 16, paragraph 5;
- Having regard to Law no. 170 dated 8<sup>th</sup> October 2010, "Norms on Specific Learning Difficulties (SpLD) in schools", and in particular article 5, paragraph 4;

Having regard to the respective resolutions of the Academic Senate dated 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2016 and of the Board of Governors dated 29<sup>th</sup> November 2016 on: a) enrolment (from March) of students who have reached the guarantee thresholds; b) conditional enrolment of students who do not meet the necessary requirements yet (upper secondary school diploma and language requirements, if any), their access to the video lessons of first-year compulsory courses and the possibility for them to take these exams in the summer/fall examination sessions; c) enrolment of students with educational qualifications awarded after a period of 12 years of school attendance, provided that these qualifications are valid for admissions to a university programme in the country where they have been awarded (this university programme must be equivalent to the programme in Italy) and if they were obtained after attending at least one school year abroad, without prejudice to bilateral agreements;

Having regard to the respective resolutions of the Academic Senate dated 19<sup>th</sup> September 2017 and of the Board of Governors dated 20<sup>th</sup> September 2017, concerning minimum admission thresholds and guaranteed admission thresholds for Bachelor's degree programmes with locally programmed admissions, and concerning the fee charged for registration for the admission test in Italy and abroad;

Having regard to the "Procedures for entry, stay and enrolment of international/foreign students in higher education courses in Italy – academic year 2018/2019" dated 19<sup>th</sup> February 2018, and awaiting for the publication of the same rules for a.y. 2019/2020;

Having regard to Rector's decree no. 907 dated 1<sup>st</sup> October 2018 – "*Initiation of admissions procedures - Admissions to Bachelor's degree programmes with locally programmed admissions – a.y. 2019/2020*" and subsequent amendments – which decrees the following: a) opening of admissions procedures; b) decision of the University to administer admissions tests abroad; c) appointment of the person in charge of the procedure and definition of the minimum admission thresholds and guaranteed admission thresholds; d) knowledge of the Italian language as an admission requirement; e) calendar of tests; f) opening of the Apply procedure; g) TIL registration fee (Test in Laib) in Italy and abroad; h) appointment of the Central Committee and the Laboratory Committee for TILs held in Italy and abroad;

Having regard to the respective resolutions of the Academic Senate dated 18<sup>th</sup> December 2018 and of the Board of Governors dated 19<sup>th</sup> December 2018 concerning the approval of the course catalogue for a.y. 2019/2020;

- Having regard to the resolution of the Academic Senate dated 18<sup>th</sup> December 2018 which states that having an English language certificate – B2 level (as defined by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages – CEFR) is an admission requirement for prospective students who apply for a Bachelor's degree programme entirely or partially taught in English;

- Having regard to the respective resolutions of the Academic Senate dated 24<sup>th</sup> January 2019 and of the Board of Governors dated 30<sup>th</sup> January 2019 which approve: a) the number of programmed admissions for a.y. 2019/2020; b) the number of quota students for a.y. 2019/2020; c) the possibility for students to attend the common first-year courses of the Engineering Bachelor's degree programmes taught in Italian in the city of Mondovì (except for the Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Production Engineering);
- Considering that Politecnico di Torino may decide to set up new TIL-I sessions in Italy and abroad during the course of the year;

Considering that the resolutions mentioned in the introduction have been made available on the University website in order to provide necessary information to prospective students and their families;

## DECREES

### Article 1

#### (Initiation of the procedure and places available)

1. Applications are invited for admissions to Bachelor's degree programmes of the Engineering area for a.y. 2019/2020. Admissions are limited to the number of student places illustrated in Annex A to this Call, of which it is an integral part.
2. The TIL-I test (Test in Laib – Engineering) is held in the University's computer laboratories (LAIB) or in other locations in Italy or abroad, as shown on: <http://orienta.polito.it/>
3. Admissions to the programmes referred to in this article are subject to prior accreditation of the same pursuant to current provisions.
4. Having considered recent trends and the number of withdrawals from studies which have taken place before 31<sup>st</sup> October in the latest academic years, in order to allocate all student places and speed up enrolment operations, the number of student places that can be assigned for each programme could be higher than the number of places illustrated in Annex A referred to in paragraph 1.

### Article 2

#### (Requirements for enrolment in Bachelor's degree programmes of the Engineering area)

1. The requirements for enrolment in Bachelor's degree programmes of the Engineering area are illustrated in Annex B and in Annex C attached to this Call, of which they are integral parts.
2. For the purposes of the ranking lists, the following student categories have been given the following meaning:
  - Quota students:** non-EU students residing outside Italy with a non-Italian educational qualification.
  - European Union students:**
    - Italian citizens, or
    - other EU nationals
  - Equivalent students:** students from Norway, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Switzerland and San Marino; non-EU nationals legally residing in Italy; diplomats; holders of an Italian upper secondary school diploma obtained in Italy or abroad (Law no. 189/2002)
3. The score obtained in the TIL-I test is only valid for enrolment in academic year 2019/20.
4. The **minimum threshold for being included in the raking list** is 20/100 for all student categories.
 

The **guaranteed admission thresholds for Bachelor's degree programmes** are the following:

  - **EU and equivalent students:** 60/100 to be admitted to the Bachelor's degree programme of first preference; 50/100 to be guaranteed admission to a Bachelor's degree programme referred to in this Call;
  - **quota students:** 60/100 to be admitted to the Bachelor's degree programme of first preference, 30/100 to be guaranteed admission to a Bachelor's degree programme referred to in this Call;
5. Applicants who meet the requirements referred to in article 3 are exempted from taking the TIL-I test.

**Article 3  
(Exemptions from the TIL-I test)**

1. Upon specific request, applicants may be exempted from taking the TIL-I test if they have a **SAT, GRE and GMAT certificate, recognized as equivalent to passing the TIL-I test** (grading equal to or higher than the guaranteed admission threshold 60/100) according to the following specifications:

	<u>Academic year 2019/20</u>
<b>SAT</b> <b>Up to March 2016</b>	SAT test (sections: Critical reading, Writing, Mathematics) and SAT Subject Test (sections: Physics and Mathematics Level 1 or 2), with a minimum score of 500 points in each section.  The three sections of the SAT test can be replaced by the <b>ACT Test</b> with a minimum score of 20.
<b>SAT</b> <b>After March 2016</b>	SAT (sections: Evidence-Based Reading and Writing, Math) and SAT Subject Test (sections: Physics and Mathematics Level 1 or 2), with a minimum score of 500 points in each section.  The two sections (Evidence-Based Reading and Writing, Math) of the SAT test can be replaced by the <b>ACT Test</b> with a minimum score of 20.
<b>GRE</b>	GRE (General Test) with a minimum score of 153 in the "Verbal" section and 144 in the "Quantitative" section and with any score in the "Analytical Writing" section.
<b>GMAT</b>	GMAT with a minimum score of 500 in the two "Verbal" and "Quantitative" sections and with any score in the "Analytical Writing" section.

2. To take advantage of the aforementioned exemption, applicants are required to submit their certificates by uploading them on their Apply@polito personal page **by Tuesday 23<sup>th</sup> July 2019**. The **outcome** of the verification process will be announced via e-mail **not later than Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2019**.
3. Applicants who have an Italian university degree included among those listed in Annex D, attached to this Call, of which it is integral part, are exempted from taking the TIL-I test. These applicants are required to enter the information on their academic background on the Apply@polito platform. Applicants who intend to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Production Engineering are not exempted from taking the TIL-I test.
4. Applicants who are going to incur in forfeiture (article 13, paragraph 2) and intend to enrol again in the same Bachelor's degree programme (if still offered) are exempted from taking the TIL-I test.
5. Applicants who are exempted from taking the TIL-I test within the meaning of this article are not entitled to the enrolment fee reduction referred to in article 11, paragraph 2.

**Article 4  
(Participation in the TIL-I test)**

1. All applicants are required to apply for the TIL-I test by registering online on the Apply@polito platform. To complete their application, applicants are also required to pay the registration fee referred to in paragraph 5 and 6. Further test days and times might be organized for the last TIL-I session in order to allow a wider participation.
2. Applicants can register on the Apply@polito platform and apply for the TIL-I test according to the following schedule and depending on their category:

3. Applicants must specify 5 different Bachelor's degree programmes in order of preference in the "Select your course" section.

**The deadline for changing the order of preference or for substituting a choice is:**

- **for EU and equivalent students: not later than Friday 30<sup>th</sup> August 2019, and in any case before enrolment, regardless of the TIL-I test date;**
  - **for quota students: Thursday 12th September 2019, and in any case before enrolment.**
4. The TIL-I tests are organized in compliance with current legislation on disabilities and specific learning difficulties. The procedures to take the TIL-I test for students referred to in this paragraph are illustrated on the University website (<https://didattica.polito.it/disabili/it/presentazione>); the same website also lists the Administration Offices to which applicants can request special arrangements to sit the TIL-I test.

In particular:

- applicants with disabilities, referred to in article 16 of Law no.104/92, are entitled to get maximum 30% extra time compared to standard test time (maximum test duration: 120 minutes)
- applicants with certified specific learning difficulties (SpLD), referred to in Law no. 170/2010, must provide valid evidence of SpDL in the form a medical certificate issued not later than 3 years ago by the Italian Health Care System (SSN) or by a specialist or health care facility recognized by the Italian system. These applicants are entitled to get maximum 30% extra time compared to standard test time (maximum test duration: 120 minutes)
- applicants with disabilities or specific learning difficulties (SpLD) who reside abroad are required to submit evidence of disability or SpLD issued in their country, together with a sworn translation into Italian or English. The university bodies in charge of examining the above-mentioned certificates ascertain that foreign documents provide evidence of a disability or a SpLD which is accepted by Italian law.

Applicants referred to in this paragraph who require special arrangements to take the TIL-I test must upload their evidence of disability or SpLD to the Apply@polito platform ("Attachments" section) by 24.00 (midnight - Italian time) of Sunday before the TIL-I test they want to take.

5. Detailed information on how to register on the Apply@polito platform, how to participate and how the TIL-I test takes place is explained on the University webpage <http://orienta.polito.it/>. The TIL-I registration fee is € 50.00.

The amount paid cannot be reimbursed under any circumstances, nor can it be considered valid for TIL sessions other than the one for which the applicant has registered.

6. The registration fee can be paid with various payment methods, including:
- Credit cards (Visa and MasterCard only – American Express is not accepted), generating an immediate payment;
  - Pre-printed notice of payment, such as for instance the MAV, generating a deferred payment.

- PagoPA, an electronic payment system that allows users of online banking services to choose a bank or a payment institution (defined as “Payment Service Provider” – PSP) among those recognized at national level.

The use of a deferred payment method (for instance, a pre-printed notice of payment) is valid solely and exclusively if it is supported by a **self-declaration** of the payment date certifying that the payment was made before the deadline and in the Italian territory. This declaration must be submitted by the same deadline. Should the self-declaration be found to be false or incorrect, the registration for the test, or the test itself, will be cancelled.

Detailed practical information as well as further possible payment methods will be published exclusively on the University webpage <http://orienta.polito.it/>

At the end of the TIL-I registration process, applicants will receive a registration confirmation by e-mail.

7. The TIL-I test, in Italy and abroad, is held in sessions according to the following calendar:

9. Applicants can take the TIL-I test in one or more subsequent sessions; when an applicant takes the test several times, **the result obtained in the latest test invalidates the score obtained in previous tests.**

#### **Article 5 (TIL-I contents)**

1. The TIL-I test is an individual test, available in English and Italian, which is different for each applicant. It is made up of automatically and randomly selected computer interface questions. All tests have an equivalent level of difficulty.
2. The TIL-I test consists of 42 questions, divided into 4 sections, with a predetermined number of questions to be finished within a pre-set time: 18 Maths questions to be performed in 40 minutes, 6 verbal comprehension questions in 12 minutes, 12 Physics questions in 26 minutes and 6 logic questions in 12 minutes. The total time for the TIL-I test is set at one hour and thirty minutes. Each question has 5 possible answers marked with the letters A, B, C, D, E, only one of which is correct.
3. The result of each individual test is determined as follows: 1 point for each correct answer, 0 points for each unanswered question and a penalty of 0.25 points for each incorrect answer. The score is converted to hundredths and calculated up to the second decimal position. At the end of the test applicants will be able to see their test result on their screens. Moreover, the last test result will be available in the applicant's personal page of the Apply@polito platform.

#### **Article 6 (Progetto Orientamento)**

1. A dedicated TIL-I session (held on 20<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2019) is reserved to students who participated in a project called "Progetto Orientamento", organized by the University in cooperation with high schools. These applicants must have carried out at least 75% of their school curriculum in the fields of Mathematics and Physics.
2. Applicants who took part in "Progetto Orientamento" must make sure that they filled in all application sections on their personal page of the Apply@polito platform by the deadline for enrolment referred to in article 11.  
They are allowed to change the order of preference of the five Bachelor's degree programmes they have chosen in the "Select your course" section or change one of them **not later than Friday 30<sup>th</sup> August 2019 and in any case before starting their enrolment process.**  
In the event that an applicant does not make any choice, he/she will lose the right to enrol at Politecnico and the right to be included in the ranking list referred to in article 8, paragraph 1, letter b).
3. The students referred to in paragraph 2 must also declare that they are interested in remaining on the ranking list after its publication as provided for in article 7, paragraph 3, and they need to do so **not later than 2.00 p.m. of Monday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2019.**
10. Applicants who take part in "Progetto Orientamento" may eventually resit the TIL-I test, starting from the March session upon previous payment of the registration fee. **In this case, the result obtained in the latest test invalidates the score obtained in the previous test.**

#### **Article 7 (Special projects)**

1. Politecnico di Torino is about to sign some specific agreements with the Municipality of Mondovì to offer students the opportunity to attend their first year courses taught in Italian (which are common to all Bachelor's degree programmes in Engineering) in the city of Mondovì. The maximum number of students is set at 180. Students enrolled in the Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Production cannot join the common programme in Mondovì due to the specificities of their first year.  
Applicants who are interested in attending their first year courses in Mondovì are required to select this option when they choose their five preferred programmes from the "Select your course" section of the Apply@polito platform.

Student places in Mondovì are assigned to applicants upon enrolment in accordance with their order on the ranking list provided that they want to confirm this choice. Students who have been admitted to attend their first year courses in Mondovì cannot take part in the “Young Talent Project” since this is delivered at the main campus in Torino (article 3).

2. Politecnico di Torino has some Decentralized Student Support Units (*Strutture Decentrate di Supporto agli Studenti - SDSS*) which offer teaching support and student services at Bachelor’s level. As far as teaching support is concerned, students who choose a Decentralized Student Support Unit can watch the video lessons prepared and distributed online by Politecnico alone or in groups, possibly under the guidance of a local tutor. These students can also attend practical classes and laboratory activities delivered by local tutors who work with Politecnico faculty members.

In a.y. 2019/20 there will be two Decentralized Student Support Units: Biella (BI) and Verrès (AO). Access to the services rendered by each Decentralized Student Support Unit is possible for students who enrol in first year of any Bachelor’s degree programme of the Engineering area (except for the programme in Industrial Production Engineering).

Applicants who are interested in attending the activities of a Decentralized Student Support Unit are required to flag this option from the “Special projects” section of the Apply@polito platform during the application process for the TIL-I test.

Successful applicants are required to confirm their choice for a specific Decentralized Student Support Unit after enrolment by completing a form available at the Office of the University Registrar of the Decentralized Student Support Unit.

The Decentralized Student Support Units will be operational if at least 20 students choose to join them by the end of the enrolment time frame.

More information on the Decentralized Student Support Units is available on the University website <https://didattica.polito.it/sdss.html>.

3. Politecnico di Torino is going to open the “Young Talent Project” also for a.y. 2019/20. This project is intended for first year students who scored at least 70/100 in the TIL-I test and enrol for the first time in the university system (student who enrol at Politecnico di Torino with the evaluation of their previous academic records are excluded from this project). For this reason, applicants referred to in article 3 are not eligible for this project.

The maximum number of students who can take part in this project is set at 200.

This project is available for students who enrol in any Bachelor’s degree programme of the Engineering area except for the programme in Industrial Production Engineering. All courses are taught in Italian.

Students can apply for this project during the online enrolment phase from the Apply@polito platform.

They will be ranked on a specific list based on their TIL-I test score.

## **Article 8 (TIL-I results)**

1. TIL-I results are made public through the publication of:
  - a. one list of all students, except for quota students, and one list of quota students who got a TIL-I score higher than or equal to the guaranteed threshold (article 2, paragraph 4) which enables applicants to enrol in the programme of first preference. These lists include the names of the applicants who have been exempted from taking the TIL-I test (article 3, paragraph 1) and will be **published at the end of each TIL-I session**.
  - b. one ranking list of all students, except for quota students, and one ranking list of quota students, for the allocation of residual student places.

Both ranking lists will be published according to the following schedule:

    - the ranking list of all students, except for quota students: **Tuesday 3<sup>th</sup> September 2019**;
    - the ranking list of quota students: **Monday 16<sup>th</sup> September 2019**.
2. The results referred to in paragraph 1 will be made public with a Rector’s decree, on the online Bulletin (*Albo online*) of the University, on the Apply@polito personal page of each applicant and on the University webpage <http://orienta.polito.it/>;

3. All applicants who do not belong to the “enrolled student” or “assigned student” categories (article 9) are required to declare that they are interested in remaining on the ranking list after its publication. Applicants are required to make this declaration on their **Apply@polito personal page – Enrolment section, not later than:**
- 2.00 p.m. of 9<sup>th</sup> September 2019 for all applicants except for quota applicants;
  - 2.00 p.m. of 20<sup>th</sup> September 2019 for quota applicants only.
- Failure to declare one’s interest in remaining on the ranking list implies that the applicant intends to decline his/her offer of admission. His/her student place will be assigned to another student on the ranking list.**

### **Article 9 (How lists and ranking lists are made)**

1. The lists referred to in article 8, paragraph 1, letter a) include the applicants who have the right to enrol in the programme of their first preference (ranked according to their TIL-I score) and the applicants who have been exempted from taking the TIL-I test within the meaning of article 3, paragraph 1.
2. The ranking lists referred to in article 8, paragraph 1, letter b) are made with the following criteria:
  - a. one single ranking list for all Bachelor’s degree programmes of the Engineering area;
  - b. applicants are ranked in descending order according to their TIL-I score;
  - c. in case of equal ranking, the score obtained in the individual sections that make up the TIL-I test shall prevail, considered in the following order: Mathematics, Verbal comprehension, Physics and Logic. In case of a further equal ranking, the younger student applicant will be chosen.
3. The ranking lists referred to in paragraph 2 classify the students into the following categories:
  - ENROLLED STUDENT: a student who has completed the first phase of online enrolment (as indicated in article 11);
  - ASSIGNED STUDENT: a student who **MUST** enrol in the Bachelor’s degree programme which has been assigned to him/her; failure to enrol by the deadline will result in the allocation of his/her student place to another applicant – **therefore, failure to enrol by the deadlines entails permanent renunciation of the place.**
  - BOOKED STUDENT: a student who can enrol in a programme that is not the programme of his/her first preference. This student is also on the waiting list for one or more programme/s with higher preference expressed during the application process.  
In this case, this student **CAN** either:
    - enrol in the assigned programme and automatically give up all the other preferences;
    - wait for the next call/s after the ranking lists are updated.
  - STUDENT ON WAITING LIST: a student who has not been offered a place for any of the degree programmes that he/she had chosen during the application process, but could be assigned a place in a non-saturated degree programme in the next call/s. This student must wait for the next the call/s.
  - INTERNAL TRANSFER NOT ALLOWED: a student currently enrolled at Politecnico who took the TIL-I test in order to transfer to another programme but has not been included in the ranking list for admission to the new programme.
  - STUDENT ADMITTED TO YEAR 2 OR BEYOND: a student currently enrolled at Politecnico or at another university, who took the TIL-I test and has been ASSIGNED a student place for admission to year 2 or beyond – after the evaluation of his/her previous academic records.
  - RENUNCIATION OF WAITING LIST: a student who did not declare that he/she was interested in remaining on the ranking list by the deadlines of article 8, paragraph 3; or, a student who explicitly renounced his/her right to be on the waiting list (article 10, paragraph 3).
  - RENUNCIATION OF ENROLMENT: a student who has been ASSIGNED a student place but has failed to enrol in the programme by the deadline.
  - NOT ADMITTED STUDENT: a student who has not reached the minimum admission threshold.



**Article 10  
(How ranking lists are updated)**

1. The students included in the ranking lists referred to in article 8, paragraph 1, letter b) are assigned a place according to their preferences, starting from the first preference and within the limit of available places, with the following criteria:
  - a. when available, the first choice is offered to the applicant (ASSIGNED student);
  - b. if the applicant's first choice is not available, the next choices are taken into consideration, until a degree programme with at least one available place is identified, and - in that case - the applicant is offered the possibility to enrol in that programme. As far as previous choices are concerned, the applicant is placed on waiting list (BOOKED student), unless all programmes with higher preferences are full (in this case the first programme with available places will be ASSIGNED to the student);
  - c. if the applicant cannot be assigned a place in any of the programmes of his/her choice, but there are residual places in other Bachelor's degree programmes, the computer system will assign the applicant a place in one of these programmes. In this case, the applicant must enrol by 27<sup>th</sup> September 2019, and in any case before classes start, on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019;
  - d. if all places have already been assigned, the student must wait for the next call/s (student ON WAITING LIST). He/she could be offered a place in a non-saturated programme in the next calls.
2. Allocations of places to students included in the ranking lists referred to in article 8, paragraph 1, letter b) are based on further updates of the ranking lists which take into account the number of students who enrol by the deadlines of article 11.
3. Students included in the ranking lists referred to in article 8, paragraph 1, letter b) who are no longer interested in enrolling at Politecnico di Torino and **intend to renounce their right to be on the waiting list**, can do so from the Apply@polito platform; when an applicant renounces his/her right to be on the waiting list, he/she irrevocably gives up his/her position on the ranking list; therefore his/her student place is assigned to another applicant on the ranking list.
4. The ranking list closing date for EU, equivalent and quota students is the deadline for any change or update of the ranking lists. Ranking lists will be closed on **Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> October 2019**.

After the ranking list closing date, **and in any case not later than Monday 18<sup>th</sup> November 2019**, new places might become available with respect to the total number of student places announced in article 1, paragraph 1, as a consequence of students who have not enrolled. These potential new places will be offered to the applicants who had chosen a specific programme as their first preference, but have already enrolled in another programme of lower preference. In this case, if the student accepts this offer, he/she will be automatically assigned to the new programme and will see this change on his/her personal page of the Teaching Portal – Segreteria online section – Changing Bachelor's degree programme.

**Article 11  
(Enrolment process)**

1. The enrolment process has two phases and is considered completed upon conclusion of both phases.
2. **First phase - online enrolment:**
  - a. **Deadlines**  
The first phase of online enrolment **for all applicants, except for quota students, has the following opening and closing dates. Applicants who do not meet these deadlines will be excluded from the enrolment process.**

**PLEASE NOTE: applicants who have not earned their upper secondary school diploma or do not have a fiscal code on the enrolment closing date for the various applicant categories (see tables above) can enrol at Politecnico di Torino “with condition” (conditional enrolment). They are required to drop this provisional condition not later than 2.00 p.m. of Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> November 2019 by adding the missing information on their Apply@polito personal page. Applicants who fail to do so will be excluded from the enrolment process even if they already paid the first instalment of their tuition fees.**

#### b. How to enrol

- Applicants are required to enrol online. At the same time they must pay the first instalment of their tuition fees. The standard amount of the first instalment is 200 €. Possible reductions or revisions of this amount will be announced in the Tuition Fee Guide for academic year 2019/2020 which is going to be approved by the university bodies at a later date.
- The Tuition Fee Guide for academic year 2019/20 illustrates which students are exempted from paying their tuition fees. It also indicates the reductions for applicants who enrol at Politecnico **before Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> August 2019** – except for applicants who are exempted from taking the TIL-I test in accordance with article 3.

The payment can be made using the following payment methods:

- Credit cards: Visa and MasterCard only (American Express is not accepted), generating an immediate payment.

- Pre-printed notice of payment, for instance the MAV, generating a deferred payment.
- PagoPA, an electronic payment system that allows users of online banking services to choose a bank or a payment institution (defined as “Payment Service Provider” – PSP) among those recognized at national level.

Practical details will be published exclusively on the University website <http://orienta.polito.it/>.

At the end of the first phase of online enrolment, students will be informed about its conclusion by e-mail.

The use of a deferred payment method (for instance, a pre-printed notice of payment) is valid solely and exclusively if it is supported by a self-declaration of the payment date certifying that the payment was made before the deadline and in Italian territory. This declaration must be submitted by the same deadline. Should the self-declaration be found to be false or incorrect, the first phase of online enrolment will be cancelled and the applicant will lose the right to enrol at Politecnico for academic year 2019/20.

At the end of the first phase of enrolment, applicants, who meet all the admission requirements and are not awaiting the evaluation of previous academic records, will receive their ID student number and must move to the second phase of enrolment.

Students who are awaiting the evaluation of previous academic records (article 12) are required to accept their offer of admission by paying the first instalment of their tuition fees before the enrolment deadline. **If they do not meet these deadlines, they will be excluded from the enrolment process.**

### 3. **Second phase - enrolment at the Office of the University Registrar:**

Enrolment becomes effective when students go to the **Office of the University Registrar**. In some cases, students are required to show the documents listed in Annex B attached to this Call (“Original documents to be presented for enrolment” section)

All students (except for students with a pending evaluation of previous academic records - article 12) must complete this enrolment phase **not later than Monday 18<sup>th</sup> November 2019. Students who do not meet these deadlines will be excluded from the enrolment process.**

#### **a. Special instructions for students with a non-Italian educational qualification**

- Before completing the second phase of enrolment, applicants with a non-Italian educational qualification **MUST** go to the Incoming Mobility Office – International Affairs Department before the above-mentioned deadline. This Office evaluates the documents listed in Annex B and Annex C attached to this Call, of which they are integral parts.

#### **b. Conditional enrolment**

- In the absence of the documents referred to in points e), h) and m) of Annex B (“Original documents to be presented for enrolment” section), students are **considered enrolled with condition** at Politecnico di Torino. This provisional condition must be dropped by 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2020 by presenting the above-mentioned documents. If these students do not present their upper secondary school diploma (Annex B, point e) by the deadline, their enrolment at Politecnico will be cancelled with immediate effect on any previous academic progress. If students do not to present the official translation into Italian of their upper secondary school diploma (Annex B, point i) and the statement of validity/ *dichiarazione di valore* of their upper secondary school diploma or certificate issued by ENIC-NARIC (Annex B, point m) before the deadline, they will be denied access to their personal page of the Teaching Portal and will be placed on a hold until they present these documents, without prejudice to the provisions of the Student Regulations on forfeiture.
- Students with a non-Italian educational qualification who are still waiting for the Regional School Office to issue the declaration of equivalence of their upper secondary school diploma, (enrolment requirement) are **considered enrolled with condition** at Politecnico di Torino. This provisional condition must be dropped by 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2020. If these students do not present this declaration by the deadline, their enrolment at Politecnico will be cancelled with immediate effect on their previous academic progress.
- Students with a student visa – type D (Annex B – point c “Original documents to be presented for enrolment” section), are **considered enrolled with condition** at Politecnico di Torino. This provisional condition must be dropped by presenting the residence permit before the deadline established in the “Procedures for entry, stay and enrolment of international/foreign students in higher education courses in Italy – academic year 2019/2020”, available at <http://www.studiare->

[in-italia.it/studentistranieri/](http://in-italia.it/studentistranieri/). If these students do not provide their residence permit before the deadline, or if they are denied the residence permit by the Italian authorities (Questura di Torino), their enrolment at Politecnico will be cancelled with immediate effect on their previous academic progress.

- Applicants who do not meet or only partially fulfil the requirements and/or documents listed in Annex B and Annex C attached to this Call lose the right to move to the second phase of enrolment and are excluded from the enrolment process permanently.
4. **Underage applicants:** applicants who are underage on the date of online enrolment must reserve their student place by paying the first instalment of the tuition fees; in order to complete the second phase of enrolment, applicants can:
- go to the Office of the University Registrar accompanied by an adult or by a legal guardian; or else,
  - go to the Office of the University Registrar bringing a self-certificate (*dichiarazione sostitutiva di certificazioni* - Articles 5 and 46 of Presidential Decree no. 445 of 28<sup>th</sup> December 2000). The self-certificate can be downloaded from the applicant's Apply@polito personal page and must be signed by a parent or legal guardian; a photocopy of the identification document of the signer must be attached as well.
- Underage applicants with a non-Italian educational qualification are required to contact the **Incoming Mobility Office** – International Affairs Department.
5. In the event of non-compliance with the deadlines referred to in this article or with the requirements listed in Annex B and Annex C attached to this Call, applicants lose the right to enrol and are not entitled to any refund of the first instalment of their tuition fees (article 11, 2.b), whatever the reason brought forward as a justification.

## Article 12

### (Students currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme or students with a university degree)

1. Students currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at Politecnico who intend to transfer to another Politecnico programme but have not earned 28 credits in the core subjects must take the TIL-I test and conveniently place themselves on the ranking list. During the TIL-I registration from the Apply@polito platform available on their personal page, these students must select the programme they want to transfer to; this choice cannot be modified. If they pass the test and are on the ranking list, they must confirm their intention to remain on the list in accordance with the deadlines of article 8, paragraph 3.  
Students currently enrolled in a Politecnico Bachelor's degree programme of the Engineering area who earn 28 credits in the core subjects within the September examination session can transfer to any other programme of the Engineering area (except for Industrial Production Engineering) without taking the TIL-I test (internal transfer).  
In order to transfer to the **Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Production Engineering, students must necessarily take and pass the admission test.**
2. Students currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at another Italian university who intend to transfer to a Bachelor's degree programme at Politecnico di Torino **must take the TIL-I test** (also if they come from a programme belonging to the same class) and must conveniently place themselves on the ranking list.  
During the application process on the Apply@polito platform, these students are required to choose 5 Bachelor's degree programmes and rank them in order of preference in the "Select your course" section. The order of preference can be modified in accordance with the provisions of article 4, paragraph 3. During the application process on the Apply@polito platform, these students must provide the details of their current Bachelor's degree programme (university, name and class of their degree programme, exams already passed with the corresponding number of credits and scientific disciplinary field, courses for which the exams are still pending, course syllabi).  
Students who pass the test and are on the ranking list for admission to a programme must confirm their intention to transfer to Politecnico on the Apply@polito platform. They are required to accept their offer of admission in accordance with the terms of article 11, paragraph 2. **If they fail to comply with these terms, they will be excluded from the enrolment process.**

After confirming the transfer, the previous academic records of these applicants are sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who decides on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.

More information and deadlines for enrolment will be available in the Student Guide - a.y. 2019/20 ("Transfers" chapter – Transfers to Politecnico di Torino from another university). The Student Guide is going to be published in June.

3. Applicants who already have an Italian university degree but are not exempted from taking the TIL-I test with the meaning of article 3, must take the TIL-I test. If they conveniently place themselves on the ranking list, they must confirm their intention to enrol at Politecnico on their personal page of the Apply@polito platform. They are required to pay the first instalment of their tuition fees in accordance with the terms and deadlines illustrated in article 11 and they need to choose the programme they want to enrol in according to the provisions of article 3, paragraph 3.

After confirming the intention to enrol at Politecnico, their previous academic records of these applicants are sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who decides on possible on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.

4. Applicants who already have an Italian university degree and are exempted from taking the TIL-I test with the meaning of article 3, paragraph 3, must check the terms and enrolment deadlines in the Student Guide - a.y. 2019/20 (Credit Transfer chapter - Credit Transfer for Bachelor's degree programmes).

### Article 13

#### (Students who are going to incur in forfeiture)

1. Students enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at Politecnico di Torino (DM 270/04) incur in automatic forfeiture on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019 if they **have not passed their compulsory first-year exams required to move to the second year of the programme** in a two-year period. In this case they can re-enrol in a Bachelor's degree programme of the Engineering area at Politecnico but they are required to **re-sit the TIL-test** (dates are available in article 4, paragraph 7) and place themselves **on the ranking list**. During the application process on the Apply@polito platform, these students are required to choose 5 Bachelor's degree programmes and rank them in order of preference in the "Select your course" section. The order of preference can be modified in accordance with the provisions of article 4, paragraph 3.
2. Students enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at Politecnico di Torino (DM 270/04) incur in automatic forfeiture on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019 if they have not passed any exam for three consecutive years. In this case they can re-enrol in the same Bachelor's degree programme (if still offered) without taking the TIL- I test, provided that they passed their compulsory first-year exams required to move to the second year of the programme.  
If that Bachelor's degree programme is no longer on the course catalogue, these students must register for the TIL-I test. During the application process on the Apply@polito platform, they are choose 5 Bachelor's degree programmes and rank them in order of preference in the "Select your course" section. The order of preference can be modified in accordance with the provisions of article 4, paragraph 3.
3. More information will be available in the Student Guide a.y. 2019/20 ("Interruption, suspension, withdrawal, forfeiture" chapter – Forfeiture)

### Article 14

#### (Possible places reserved to quota students that remain unassigned)

1. After the publication of the list and the ranking list of quota students, referred to in article 8, paragraph 2, letter b), places which are vacant or unassigned as a consequence of failure to pass the minimum admission threshold will be promptly notified to the Ministry of Education (MIUR).
2. These places cannot be reassigned to other quota students who have not taken the admission test at Politecnico di Torino. Considering that the last TIL-I session for quota students takes place on 12<sup>th</sup> September 2019, these places cannot be made available for quota students who have not been admitted to other Italian universities.
3. Residual places which are not offered to quota students within the meaning of the previous paragraph 2 will be assigned to EU and equivalent students.

**Article 15**  
**(Applicants who take multiple admission tests)**

1. Applicants who took multiple tests for admission to various Bachelor's degree programmes offered by Politecnico may be eligible for enrolment in an Engineering programme and on a waiting list for one or more Architecture programmes. In this case, they must enrol before the deadline in order to avoid losing their place in the Engineering programme. Subsequently, if they find out that they have been admitted to a degree programme of the Architecture area and they wish to enrol in that programme, they need to go to the Office of Student Services in person to modify their choice **before the deadline for enrolment**.
2. Applicants who took the TIL-I test and are awaiting the results of the admission tests to other universities must enrol before the deadline in order to avoid losing their place; subsequently, if these applicants find out that they have been admitted to another university, they need to go to the Office of Student Services and make a request for withdrawal/transfer to the other university. Tuition fees previously paid by these students will not be refunded under any circumstances.

The processing of personal data is based on the principles of correctness, lawfulness and relevance of purposes.
