1 POLITECNICO DI TORINO AND TORINO

1.1 Politecnico di Torino

Politecnico di Torino was the first Italian Engineering School, founded in the wave of the technical and scientific innovation that gave rise to the most prestigious European polytechnic schools in the mid-19th century. Founded as a School for Engineers in 1859, it then became Regio Politecnico di Torino in 1906. Engineers, architects, designers and urban planners have been trained at Politecnico di Torino for over 160 years with rigor, integrity and high-level standards.

This long ever-changing history has rated Politecnico among the top

European technical Universities for education and research, with 38,700 students and a teaching staff of more than 1,000.

Each year, above 5,000 students from more than 100 countries choose

PoliTo not just to receive a technical education but to get a wide range of
opportunities granted by the University collaborations with industries, public
institutions and local organizations. PoliTO is an international level research
University which goal is to find solutions for contemporary society challenges, to
imagine a sustainable future without forgetting social, ethical, economic and
environmental implications.

1.2 Torino, a city to discover

Situated in the North West of Italy, Torino was the first capital of Italy in 1861. Thanks to its historical importance, the city has been able to innovate without losing its ancient elegance. Torino is today home for national and international companies that enhance its reputation, while it is also considered a prestigious academic pole and a liveable and enjoyable environment for young people. It is considered one of the most sustainable cities in Europe, thanks to its parks and tree-lined avenues. Its strategic nearness to the Langhe area (UNESCO Heritage), the Alpi mountains and the region of Liguria makes Torino a key place where starting to discover the 'Bel Paese'.

1.3 Cost of living


Compared with other Italian cities Torino can be considered as a low

cost city: the cost of rent and services is less expensive

than in other metropolitan cities.

For example one of the most convenient place to shop for groceries is Porta Palazzo Market, which is also the biggest one in Europe. It offers a variety of traditional and international food at very affordable prices.

2 HOW TO PLAN YOUR ARRIVAL

2.1 Requirements to enter Italy

- •Non-European citizens → you need to apply for a study visa to enter Italy through the registration on <u>Universitaly website;</u>
- •Non-European citizens holding also a European citizenship >
 you can travel with your valid European passport without
 applying for the study visa;
- •Non-European citizens living in a Schengen country and holding a residence permit card issued by the <u>Schengen</u>

 <u>country</u> they are living in → verify with the Italian Embassy of the country you are living if according to the current Italian immigration law you are exempted from the Visa request;
- European citizens → you can travel with your valid ID/passport without any other formalities.

2.2 How to reach Torino

By plane

3.2 Long stay requirements

Non-EU Citizens

If you are a non-EU citizen, who enters Italy with a study visa and plans to stay for more than 90 days, you must apply for a residence permit within 8 working days after your arrival.

You can receive assistance with the residence permit application process upon your arrival directly at PoliTO. Book your appointment from your Student Page (Portale della Didattica) and come prepared with the required documentation. More details about the documentation can be found on our website.

We will be organizing pre-arrival webinars to provide information and guidance on the residence permit procedures, aiming to facilitate a better understanding of the process. Join our webinars to get valuable insights and simplify your experience with obtaining a residence permit.

European Citizens

If you are a European Union Citizens you must not apply for the residence permit but you have to register at the *Anagrafe* Office three months after the arrival (for stays longer than 3 months).

3.3 Italian Fiscal Code

The Italian Fiscal Code is a code made up of letters and numbers based on of your first name, family name, date and place of birth and it is used by the Public Administration to identify people.

It can be issued, signed and printed, by:

- the Italian Consulate/Embassy in your country → if you request it <u>before your</u>
 <u>arrival in Italy;</u>
- the Revenue Agency (Agenzia delle Entrate) → if you request it after your
 arrival in Italy.

During the months of September, October, February and March officers from the *Agenzia delle Entrate* are available at Politecnico di Torino. Book your appointment from your Student Page (Portale della Didattica) and come prepared with the required documentation.

3.4 Getting familiar with Torino 3.4.1 Transport system

GTT is the local public transport provider. Thanks to the well-connected transports system it is possible to easily move from one area of the city to the other. With a student subscription, you can access to metro, tram, bus whenever you need.

If you are under 26 years old you can benefit from a discount: the monthly ticket costs € 25 and the annual one costs € 258. For additional info visit the GTT webpage here.

Apart from public transport, there are several shared mobility services:

- Bike Sharing
- Car and Moto Sharing
- Electric Scooter Sharing

3.4.2 Culture

Torino has an important and attractive cultural heritage: new and contemporary architecture balanced among the roman urban planning, interactive museums and cultural locations located not only in town but also outside the city.

Discover the Royal Residences, the palaces and museums, the parks and treelined avenues, the river and the mountains, the historic restaurants and cafes, the great events offered by the city. For young people under 26 there is the possibility to buy the annual Museum

Pass that allows the entrance to many museums and city galleries of Piedmont any time you want.

Free entrance days - First Sunday of the month at (booking necessary from the website of the museum):

- Musei Reali di Torino: Palazzo Reale, Armeria Reale, Cappella Sindone, Galleria Sabauda and Museo Antichità
- Palazzo Carignano
- Villa della Regina

3.4.3 Shopping

Torino offers a high range of shopping opportunities: typical food like *Gianduiotto*, local handicraft, tailor made clothes and design pieces.

The city center is the perfect place where to go shopping: Via Roma and the parallel pedestrian streets, Via Lagrange and Via Carlo Alberto with its historical boutiques, Via Garibaldi among Europe's longest pedestrian streets are the starting point for your purchases.

3.4.4 Bank, Post Office, Hospitals

- Poste Italiane: It is the Italian postal service provider where can send and
 receive parcels from anywhere in the world. It also offers banking and
 residence permit bureaucratic services. Inside the Politecnico di Torino
 facilities there is a branch in Via D'Ovidio 8.
- Banks: In the city there are several banks among which students can choose.
 At the Politecnico di Torino (Via d'Ovidio 6) you can find a branch of UniCredit bank.
- Hospitals: Public Italian hospitals are run by the Italian National Health
 Service. They are open 24 hours a day with Emergency Rooms (*Pronto*Soccorso) offering assistance in urgent cases. Modalities for accessing the
 services provided by the Italian National Health Service depend on the type of
 health insurance you hold.

4.1 PoliTO Community

4.1.1 Buddy and WeAreHERe

Buddy Program for Bachelor and Master of Science students

If you are a Bachelor or Master of Science student you can receive support from your Buddy! Upon your enrolment at PoliTO you will be contacted by your Buddy after few weeks.

The Buddy Program involved master's degree students, who are requested to support freshmen in their transition from High-school to University. The Buddy is usually a student who is attending one of the last years of a degree program. Since s/he is more experienced, s/he will be able to provide freshmen with useful information such as:

- How to manage university life;
- How to interact with university offices and administration in general;
- Share his/her personal experience inside and outside the Politecnico, providing information about the City;
- Promote the Italian culture and the integration of foreign students.

4.2.2 Language Centre

One of them is inside Politecnico di Torino and can be accessed from Corso Castelfidardo, 30/A.

Your PoliTo Smart Card will allow you to have both lunch and dinner.

Students enrolled in a Bachelor or Master of Science course → can access to all the canteens and pay according to the price bracket. To take advantage of the reduced rates you have to submit your application, otherwise you will pay the full rate.

<u>Students participating in exchange programmes</u> → automatically have a reduced price reserved.

4.3 PoliTO Inclusion and support

4.3.1 Counseling Service and Passi@PoliTO

Counseling Service is dedicated to all those facing psychological distress attributable to complex situations experienced in the university environment. The service is also open to technical/administrative/librarian/doctoral/research staff (etc.) who want to improve the way they deal with stressful situations, learning to manage their emotions.

Thus, the Service provides support for: problems related to the study and methodology used inability to handle stressful situations, emotional overload issues of self-esteem and motivation, health concerns

Passi@PoliTo is a psychological counseling service that offers a space, in presence and remotely, for listening and understanding of practical difficulties and emotional issues that may arise during the course of studies and experience in Torino. It aims to facilitate the presence and improve the process of academic insertion and local integration of international male and female students enrolled in the two universities, mainly from non-EU countries characterized by the use of educational, scholastic and social models that are culturally different from European ones.

The service is **free** and bookable **by appointment** at <u>passi@polito.it</u>.



4.3.2 Special Needs

Special Needs Unit gives support to students with SpLD (Specific Learning Disorder), students with disabilities (physical, sensory, relational, cognitive) and students with temporary health problems. International Students with special needs must provide medical documentation, attesting the state of disability, SpLD or temporary

difficulty for health reasons, issued in the country of residence.

The documents must be official and must be drawn up in one of the following languages: Italian, English, French, Spanish. If the official documents are in other languages, it is necessary to attach the official translation into Italian or English. Students can enter the medical certificate in the apply procedure, or send it by ticket to the Special Needs Unit in pdf format. Here the website.

4.3.3 Confidential Counselor

The Confidential Counselor is appointed by Politecnico and has the task of providing advice and assistance to anyone who suffered from sexual or moral harassment or discriminatory behavior. The Confidential Counselor is also in charge to implement the principles listed in the Code of Conduct, promoting the

protection of the dignity of female and male workers and university students. Furthermore, the main task of the Counselor is to guarantee the right to a working and study environment, encouraging the development of interpersonal relationships. 4.4 PoliTO tools

4.4.1 PoliTO Smart Card

Each exchange student is provided with a student card called Smart Card. It is used to:

- · identify each student;
- access PoliTO facilities when you are entitled to;
- pay the meal at the university canteens.

It has to be collected upon appointment at the Registrar's Office.

4.4.2 PoliTO Students app and Portale della Didattica

PoliTO Students → is the 'Students App', the new official app of PoliTO, designed for and in collaboration with its students. Designed with an Open Source approach to grow with the contribution of the PoliTO community, it allows you to manage your academic career through smartphones and tablets.

Portale della Didattica → is the tool that allows you to reserve an exam or look at your learning agreement/study plan, check the registered grades, pay the external taxes (if it is due) and print your documents.

4.4.3 PoliTO institutional e-mail account

Each PoliTO student has an email address related to the student's number ID (matricula) assigned at the enrolment (sMATRICOLA@studenti.polito.it).

For example, if your matricula number is 123456, your email address will be: s123456@studenti.polito.it.

Important communications by PoliTo offices are sent to **this e-mail address**; therefore, remember to frequently check it!

4.4.4 PoliTO Wi-Fi

In all Politecnico di Torino campuses you can find a free Wi-Fi.

In order to access the PoliTO Wi-Fi wireless LAN network you need to use your PoliTO email address and password to access.

4.6 Emergency and safety

Politecnico Medical Service

In Corso Duca degli Abruzzi campus there is a <u>Medical Service</u> (*infermeria*) with specialized staff that can assist you in an emergency situation.

Safety rules

Do not carry your passport with you (a copy will be sufficient). If you are a Non-EU citizen, bring always with you at least a copy of the residence permit or of the postal receipt of the residence permit application.

Do not keep your credit card in your wallet but in a different place. Look out for pickpockets on trams and buses.

Remember, even at the Politecnico di Torino, to keep an eye on your bags, backpacks, mobile phone and laptop.
