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Art. 1 (Initiation of the procedure and places available)

1. Applications are invited for admissions to the Bachelor's degree programmes of the Engineering area and to the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies for a.y. 2025/26. Admissions are limited to the number of student places illustrated in Annex A to this Call.
2. Annexes A,B, C and D are integral parts of this Call for applications.
3. For the purposes of defining the ranking lists, the following categories have been given the following meaning:
European Union applicants: Italian citizens or other EU nationals;
Equivalent applicants:
 - applicants from Norway, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Switzerland and San Marino;
 - non-EU nationals legally residing in Italy with a valid residence permit for study, work or family reasons;
 - political refugees;
 - staff members of Foreign Diplomatic Missions (Embassies/Consulates) and International Organizations based in Italy, legally accredited to the Italian Government or to the Holy See (including family members: spouse and children);**Non-EU applicants living abroad requiring visa**
4. **Enrolment in the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial manufacturing Technologies is possible exclusively for EU and Equivalent applicants.**
5. Having considered the recent trends and the number of withdrawals which have taken place before 31st October in the latest academic years, the number of student places that can be assigned for each programme could be higher than the number of places illustrated in Annex A referred to in par. 1.
6. Applicants can register for the admission test (art. 3 and 4) on the Apply@polito platform starting from **Tuesday 28th January 2025**.

Art. 2 (Admission requirements)

1. The requirements for admission to the Bachelor's degree programmes of the Engineering area and to the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies are the following:
 - passing the admission test (TIL-I / Test in Laib – Ingegneria) in accordance with the grades and the thresholds illustrated in art. 7;
 - meeting the enrolment requirements of Annex B "*Requirements for enrolment in the Bachelor's degree programmes of the Engineering area and in the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies for a.y. 2025/26*";
 - meeting the specific requirements of Annex C "*Specific requirements for UK, Scottish, US high school diplomas and International Baccalaureate Diploma - a.y. 2025/26*".
2. Admissions to the Bachelor's degree programmes referred to in this article are subject to prior accreditation of the programmes themselves pursuant to current legislation.
3. The score obtained by the applicants in the TIL-I test is only valid for enrolment in academic year 2025/2026. For this reason, when applicants register for the TIL-I test, they must be attending their last year of high school (i.e. they should be getting their high school diploma in the summer of 2025 according to the Italian school calendar) or they must have already earned their high school diploma.
4. For admissions to all Bachelor's degree programmes, non-EU applicants residing abroad and requiring visa (art.1, par. 3) who come from countries with a school system that



allows children to start school earlier and get their high school diploma before the age of 18, must necessarily be 17 years old when they obtain their entry visa for study purposes.

Art. 3 (Admission test dates and registration time frames)

1. **All applicants are required to take the TIL-I test in person at Politecnico.** There is a specific registration time frame for each test session. The following table illustrates the calendar of TIL-I tests delivered in the **computer labs (LAIB)** of the main campus and of the Mondovì campus.

Other TIL tests will be delivered at the Politecnico HUB in Uzbekistan. Test dates and other practical details will be published on the website of Politecnico at:

- Applicants are allowed to register for a TIL-I session until all places are filled up. The last session is scheduled on:
 - Friday 9th May 2025** for non-EU applicants living abroad and requiring visa;
 - Friday 29th August 2025** for EU applicants and Equivalent applicants.
- Applicants are allowed to take the TIL test for a maximum of 3 times totally, but only one time per session.** If an applicant takes the test more than once, **Politecnico will consider the highest score obtained** by the applicant in the various tests. Applicants are not allowed to cancel their registration from a test date after registration. If a test is declared invalid due to the applicant's incorrect behaviour (see art. 8), the test will in any case count towards the three possible attempts.
- Applicants are not allowed to register for more than one test date at the same time.** They can register for a new test date exclusively after taking the test for which they have already registered.
- If an applicant has already registered for a certain test date, the system will not allow the applicant to register for another test date that is scheduled before.
- Applicants are allowed to choose the time slot they prefer among the available time slots. After paying the registration fee, applicants will be able to see the exact location of the test (laib) on their personal page of the Apply@polito platform.

Art. 4

(How to register for and take the TIL-I test)

- All applicants are required to register for the TIL-I test online on the Apply@polito platform. To complete their application, applicants are also required to pay the registration fee referred to in the next paragraphs 3 and 4.
- Applicants must choose up to a **maximum of 5 Bachelor's degree programmes** of the Engineering area, including the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies, and rank them **in order of preference** in the "Select your programme" section.



Applicants are allowed to add one or more programmes, change the order of preference or substitute a choice before starting the student place reservation process and in any case by the following deadlines:

- **Friday 9th May 2025** for non-EU applicants living abroad and requiring visa;
 - **Friday 29th August 2025** for EU applicants and Equivalent applicants.
3. The TIL-I registration fee is € 50.00. The amount paid **cannot be reimbursed under any circumstances**, nor can it be considered valid for TIL sessions other than the one for which the applicant has registered.
 4. Payment methods are the following:
 - a. credit cards (or other payment methods available on the PagoPA platform) generating **immediate payment and registration confirmation**;
 - b. pre-printed notice of payment (MAV on the PagoPA platform), generating a **deferred payment**. In this case the applicant's successful registration for the test will be confirmed after Politecnico receives the payment confirmation from its bank. If an applicant does not pay by the deadline indicated in the notice of payment, the registration for the test will not be confirmed.
 5. We recommend all applicants to start the above-mentioned procedures well in advance of the deadlines in order to avoid that possible technical problems may hinder to complete the process.

Art. 5

(How to register for and take the TIL-I test – applicants with disabilities or with Specific Learning Disorders)

1. In person TIL-I tests are organized in compliance with current legislation on disabilities and specific learning disorders. The procedures to take the TIL-I test for the applicants referred to in this paragraph are illustrated in the present Call. Applicants can request more information on the special arrangements provided to applicants with disabilities and specific learning disorders to the Special Needs Unit of Politecnico di Torino (<https://www.polito.it/en/education/services-and-life-at-politecnico/welcome-inclusion-and-support/inclusive-teaching>) by sending a ticket through the Ticketing Support System.
In particular, for organizational purposes:
 - applicants with disabilities or with an invalidity certificate (art. 16 of Law no.104/92) must present **a valid certificate issued by the local medical board specifying the type of disability and/or the degree of invalidity** at least 15 days before the TIL-I test date.
 - applicants with disabilities or certified specific learning disorders (SpLD), referred to in Law no. 170/2010, must present **a valid certificate issued not later than 3 years ago (if the certificate was released before turning 18 years old) by the Italian Health Care System (SSN) or by a specialist or by a health care facility recognized by the Italian system**. The certificate must be presented at least 15 days before the TIL-I test date.
 - applicants with disabilities or specific learning disorders (SpLD) who reside abroad and intend to request special arrangements for the TIL-I test must present a certificate of disability or SpLD issued in their country. These documents must be official documents stamped by the issuing institution, signed by an official of the institution and written in one of the following languages: Italian, English, French, Spanish. For documents written in other languages, applicants must provide both the original document and its translation into Italian or English in a single file. The university bodies in charge of examining the above-mentioned certificates will verify if the foreign documents provide evidence of a disability or a SpLD accepted by Italian law.
2. Applicants with a valid certificate have the right to get extra time to complete the test (up to 30% extra time for applicants with SpLD, up to 50% extra time for applicants with disabilities) and are allowed to use a non-programmable calculator.
3. Applicants who need other kinds of arrangements (such as the help of a tutor to use the PC for applicants with visual impairment or with upper limb motor impairment, or the help of a sign language interpreter) must inform the Special Needs Unit by ticket with



adequate prior notice and in any case no later than 15 days before the test. Considering that organizing such special arrangements requires time, late requests may not be considered.

4. To make the TIL-I tests more accessible, applicants can make use of the "ReadSpeaker" to listen to the audio descriptions of the texts. Applicants are required to use their own devices (headphones with USB port). Applicants should also bring their own calculator.
5. Applicants referred to in this article must **upload their certificate of disability/ SpLD to the Apply@polito platform** ("Personal information" section) **no later than 15 days before the date of the TIL-I test**.
6. The Special Needs Unit of Politecnico di Torino will check the certificates which must comply with the requirements listed in paragraph 1.

Art. 6 (TIL-I contents)

1. The TIL-I test is an individual test, available in English and Italian, which is different for each applicant. It is made up of automatically and randomly selected computer interface questions. All tests have an equivalent level of difficulty.
2. The TIL-I test consists of 42 questions, divided into 4 sections, with a predetermined number of questions to be finished within a pre-set time:
 - 16 Math questions in 36 minutes
 - 10 Reading Comprehension and Logical Reasoning questions in 20 minutes
 - 10 Physics questions in 22 minutes
 - 6 Basic Technical Knowledge questions in 12 minutes

The total time for the TIL-I test is set at one hour and thirty minutes.

Each question has 5 possible answers marked with the letters A, B, C, D, E, only one of which is correct.

Art. 7 (Test evaluation and admission thresholds)

1. The result of each individual test is determined as follows:
 - 1 point for each correct answer
 - 0 points for each unanswered question
 - A penalty of 0.25 points (-0.25) for each incorrect questionThe score is converted to hundredths and rounded up to the second decimal position. At the end of the test, applicants will be able to see their score on the screen. Moreover, the test result will be available in the applicant personal page of the Apply@polito platform.
2. Applicants, including applicants admitted to Politecnico, who score less than 4,8/16 in the Mathematics section (which corresponds to less than 30% of the maximum score for the section) will have to fulfil some supplementary academic obligations (in Italian, *Obblighi Formativi Aggiuntivi - OFA*). In particular:
 - they will be invited to attend tutoring math classes during Year 1;
 - they are required to attend a course called «C.I.A.O. - Corso Interattivo di Accompagnamento Online» (online interactive support course). This course is normally offered in the week before the beginning of classes. It seeks to help applicants fill in the gaps in their Math knowledge through specific online tutoring sessions.

More details on this course will be available in the applicant's personal page of the Apply@polito platform, under the "TIL-I" section.

The Student Guide and the Teaching Regulations of each Bachelor's degree programme explain how students can fulfil their OFA.

3. The **minimum thresholds for being included in the ranking lists** are the following:
 - **30/100** for admission to the **Bachelor's degree programmes of the Engineering area**.



- a score greater than zero (0) for admission to the **Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies**.
4. The **guaranteed admission threshold** is **60/100**. This score enables applicants to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme they have chosen as their first preference.

Art. 8 **(Cases in which the test is declared invalid)**

1. During the in-person test applicants must abide by the following conduct rules, otherwise the test may be declared invalid:
 - be absolutely silent during the test, except when they need to ask a question to test supervisor.
 - exclusively make use of the blank sheets of paper and the pen/pencil provided by Supervision Committee;
 - it is forbidden to make use of personal materials such as sheets of paper, notebooks, notes, calculators, earphones or headphones (except for applicants entitled to extra time – art. 5) or other materials including mobile phones and smartwatches which **must remain switched off** at all times and must be placed on the desk; moreover, in compliance with art. 13 of D.P.R. 487 of 1994, "if the mobile phone emits any kind of sound during the test (alarms, wake up alarms, vibrations or other), the applicant will be invited to leave the classroom and will be excluded from the selection process with no exceptions".
2. In the event that the test is declared invalid for infringement of the conduct rules referred to in the previous paragraph, the applicant is not entitled to any refund of the test registration fee. If a test is declared invalid due to incorrect behaviour (see art. 8), the test will in any case count towards the three possible attempts.

Art. 9 **(Progetto Orientamento Formativo)**

1. Applicants who have taken part in the Project "Progetto Orientamento Formativo" and are eligible to take the admission test can choose to take it in one of the sessions listed in the table of art. 3 without paying the registration fee.
2. If these applicants want to retake the TIL-I test, they are allowed to retake it 2 more times. In this case they must pay the registration fee in full (art. 4, par. 3). Politecnico will consider the **highest score** obtained by the applicant in all the tests.
3. Applicants who are participating in the "Progetto Orientamento" must strictly abide by the general procedures illustrated in this Call.

Art. 10 **(TIL-I results and date of publication of the ranking list)**

1. The TIL-I results are divided in two groups (EU/equivalent applicants and non-EU applicants requiring visa) and they are made public through the publication of:
 - the list of the applicants who have scored higher than or equal to the guaranteed admission threshold (art. 7, par. 4)). This score enables applicants to reserve their student place/enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme chosen as their first preference. This list will be published **after each TIL-I session**. Successful applicants will be able to reserve their student place/enrol only after the test has been checked against irregularities by the Central Committee within three working days of the test date; if the test is declared invalid, the applicant will receive a mail (pec);
 - a merit-based ranking list for each Bachelor's degree programme for the allocation of residual student places. This ranking list includes the applicants who are exempted



from taking the admission test (art. 13, par. 1) and the applicants who have scored higher than or equal to the guaranteed admission threshold.

The ranking lists will be published on:

- a) **Tuesday 20th May 2025** for non-EU applicants residing abroad and requiring visa
- b) **Thursday 4th September 2025** for EU applicants and Equivalent applicants.

Please note that applicants will be included **exclusively in the ranking lists of the Bachelor's degree programmes that they have selected during the application process** on the Apply@polito platform.

2. The above-mentioned ranking lists will be published in the online University Bulletin (Albo online) and/or at this link [Calls for applications](#).
3. The "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025-26" - which will be published on the university website **by 27th March 2025** (enrolment opening date) - will illustrate the cases in which applicants need to reserve their student place before enrolling in a Bachelor's degree programme. The "Enrolment regulations" will be published **by Thursday 27th March 2025** (enrolment opening date) on Polito website in the "[Calls for applications, Regulations and Ranking lists](#)" section.

Art. 11

(List of applicants who scored higher than the guaranteed admission threshold and ranking lists)

1. The applicants who have scored higher than or equal to the guaranteed admission threshold are entitled to reserve their student place /enrol in the programme chosen as their first preference following the order of the ranking list.
2. The ranking lists are made with the following criteria:
 - a. there is a separate ranking list for each Bachelor's degree programme;
 - b. applicants are ranked in descending order based on their TIL-I score;
 - c. in case of equal ranking, the score obtained in the individual sections that make up the TIL-I test shall prevail, considered in the following order: Mathematics, Reading comprehension and Logical Reasoning, Physics and Basic Technical Knowledge. In case of a further equal ranking, the younger applicant will be chosen.
3. The ranking lists classify prospective students into the following categories:
 - ENROLLED STUDENT WITH INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE: a student who has got a valid international certificate (see art. 13, par. 1) and has already enrolled;
 - ASSIGNED STUDENT WITH INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE: a student with a valid international certificate (art.13, par. 1) who **MUST** reserve his/her student place/enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme assigned to him/her before the deadline for the update of the ranking list (see art. 14);
 - ENROLLED STUDENT: a student who has reserved his/her student place or has completed the online enrolment process (see art. 14);
 - ASSIGNED STUDENT: a student who **MUST** reserve his/her student place or enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme assigned to him/her before the deadline for the update of the ranking list (see art. 14); failure to reserve the student place/enrol by the deadline will result in the allocation of his/her place to the next applicant on the ranking list – **therefore, failure to reserve one's student place/enrol by the deadlines of art. 14 entails permanent renunciation of the place.**
 - STUDENT ASSIGNED TO ANOTHER PROGRAMME: when an applicant is on various ranking lists and is ASSIGNED to the first programme with vacant places among the programmes chosen during the application process. In this case, his/her status on the ranking lists of the other programmes is ASSIGNED TO ANOTHER PROGRAMME;
 - BOOKED STUDENT: a student who can reserve his/her student place/enrol in a programme that is not the programme of his/her first preference. At the same time, this student may also be on the waiting list for one or more programme/s with higher preference based on the order of preference that he/she has expressed during the application process.

In this case, the student **CAN** either:



- reserve his/her student place and enrol in the programme that has been assigned to him/her and automatically give up the other preferences; or else,
- wait for the next offers of admission after the next update/s of the ranking list.

If the applicant does not reserve his/her student place, Politecnico will consider that he/she intends to wait for the next offers of admission after the next update/s of the ranking list.

- **STUDENT ON WAITING LIST:** a student who has not been offered a place in any Bachelor's degree programme chosen during the application process, but could be offered a place in a degree programme that is not filled up in the next call/s if another student with a better score on the ranking list decides to renounce the right to enrol. This student must wait for the next offers of admission after the next update/s of the ranking list.
- **WAITING LIST RENUNCIATION:** a student who has explicitly renounced his/her right to be on the waiting list (art. 12, par. 3).
- **ENROLMENT RENUNCIATION:**
 - a student who has been ASSIGNED a place but has failed to reserve his/her student place / enrol by the deadline;
 - a student who has ENROLLED in a programme but has withdrawn from it before the closing date of the ranking list/ before the update of the ranking list referred in art. 12, par. 4 and in art 14, par. 1.
- **NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO UNFULFILLED LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS:** a student who has correctly reserved his/her student place but is not allowed to enrol since he/she does not meet the language requirements illustrated in Annex B to this Call.
- **NOT ADMITTED STUDENT:** a student who has not reached the minimum admission threshold.
- **NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO FILLED UP PROGRAMME:** a student who cannot be assigned a place because the Bachelor's degree programme is filled up (as per Annex A);
- **NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO CLOSED RANKING LISTS:** a student who has not been admitted since the ranking lists were already closed when he/she decided to enrol (see art. 12, par. 4).

Art. 12 (How the ranking lists are updated)

1. The applicants included in the ranking lists with the ASSIGNED status will be offered a place based on their preferences, starting from the first preference and within the limit of available places, using the following criteria:
 - a. if there is a place available in the programme that the applicant has chosen as his/her first preference, the applicant is offered a place in that programme (ASSIGNED student); his/her position on the ranking lists of the programmes of lower preference will not be calculated.
 - b. if the applicant's first choice is not available, the next choices are taken into consideration, until a programme with at least one available place is identified. At this point, the applicant can choose between two options:
 - enrol in the programme assigned to him/her. In this case, his/her status in the ranking lists of the other programmes is ASSIGNED TO ANOTHER PROGRAMME;
 - wait for the next updates of the ranking lists and see if new places become available in the degree programmes for which he/she has a BOOKED status.
 - c. If all programmes with higher preference are filled up, the applicant will be ASSIGNED to the next programme with vacant places; In this case, his/her status on the ranking lists of the other programmes is ASSIGNED TO ANOTHER PROGRAMME.
 - d. Considering that each Bachelor's degree programme is capped to a predefined number of student places, offers of admission will be made to the applicants who



have obtained the best scores in the TIL test until all places are filled up. For this reason, applicants who have not reached the admission threshold referred to in art. 7, par. 4 may not be admitted to any of the programmes chosen during the application process. In this case, depending on the TIL score, these applicants may be given the status of STUDENT ON WAITING LIST or NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO FILLED UP or – on the closing date of the ranking lists - NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO CLOSED RANKING LISTS.

2. Allocations of places to the applicants included in the ranking lists are based on the updates of the ranking lists which depend on the number of students who reserve their place and enrol online before the deadlines of art. 14 comma 1.
3. The applicants included in the ranking lists who are no longer interested in enrolling at Politecnico di Torino and **intend to renounce their right to be on the waiting list**, are kindly invited to communicate this decision to Politecnico through the Apply@polito platform; **when an applicant renounces his/her right to be on the waiting list, he/she irrevocably gives up his/her position on the ranking list**; therefore his/her student place is assigned to the next applicant on the ranking list.
4. The **ranking lists will be closed** on:
 - a. **Friday 27th June 2025** for non-EU applicants residing abroad and requiring visa;
 - b. **Tuesday 21st October 2025** for EU applicants and Equivalent applicants;**Enrolment will no longer be possible after the closing date of the ranking lists.**

Art. 13 (Exemptions from the TIL-I test)

1. Upon specific request, applicants may be exempted from taking the TIL-I test if they have a **SAT certificate, recognized as equivalent to passing the TIL-I test** (score equal to or higher than the guaranteed admission threshold) according to the following specifications:

Certificate	Required scores
<u>SAT</u>	SAT (section "Evidence-Based Reading and Writing and Math" with a minimum score of 650 points in each section). Upon registration for the SAT test, applicants must ask the Examination Board (College Board) to automatically send the certificate to Politecnico di Torino (institution code: 7679)

2. To be exempted from the TIL-I test, applicants are required to:
 - Fill out the specific section on the Apply@polito platform with the details of the certificate **not later than Monday 7th April 2025**. The **outcome** of the verification process will be communicated via e-mail by **Thursday 24th April 2024**.
 - ask the Examination Board (College Board) to send the certificate to Politecnico di Torino for verification by **Monday 7th April 2025**.
3. Applicants with an Italian university degree included among those listed in Annex D are exempted from taking the TIL-I test. These applicants are required to enter the information on their academic degree on the Apply@polito platform.
4. The applicants who have forfeited from studies or will incur in forfeiture (according to art. 19, par. 1) are exempted from taking the TIL-I test. The exemption does not apply to the **Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Production Engineering or in the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies** (compulsory admission test).



**Art. 14
(Enrolment requirements and process)**

1. All applicants are strictly required to meet the deadlines illustrated in the table below. Failure to meet these deadlines entails permanent exclusion from the enrolment process.

Before this deadline, applicants are required to fill in the "Language skills" section of the Apply@polito platform entering the information on their English language certificate and/or Italian language certificate required for admission.

6. Applicants who have reserved their student place by the deadline (Italian or non-Italian high school diploma) and who meet the language requirements (art. 5 of the present article – applicants with non-Italian high school diploma) must enrol online by Tuesday **30th September 2025 at 2.00 p.m.** In the event of further updates of the ranking lists and consequent new offers of admission, a new enrolment deadline will be announced and published on the applicant's personal page of the Apply@polito platform.
7. **Applicants who do not meet the deadlines of this article or the admission requirements listed in Annex B and Annex C** lose their right to enrol at Politecnico and will **not be entitled to ask for refund of the first instalment of the tuition fees**, no matter the justification brought forward.
8. **The general instructions for enrolment** will be illustrated in the "*Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26*" which are going to be published by **Thursday 27th March 2025** (enrolment opening date).

Art. 15

(Applicants who take more than one admission test)

1. Applicants who have taken more than one test for admission to various Bachelor's degree programmes offered by Politecnico may be eligible for enrolment in an Engineering programme and/or in the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies and at the same time they may be on waiting list for admission to another programme (Architecture, Design or Planning). In this case, they must reserve their student place or enrol in the assigned programme before the deadline in order to avoid losing their place. Subsequently, if they find out that they have been admitted to another programme (Architecture, Design or Planning) and they prefer to enrol in that programme, they will have to choose one of the following options using the online system:
 - withdraw from the Bachelor's degree programme in which they have enrolled ("withdrawal from studies"), following these steps:
 - a. fill out an online form available on their personal page of the Teaching Portal.
 - b. pay 16.00 Euro for the virtual revenue stamp required for the withdrawal (this amount must be paid from the personal page of the Teaching Portal).
 - c. enrol in the new Bachelor's degree programme after they receive the withdrawal confirmation (an e-mail confirming their withdrawal will be sent to their Polito mailbox). To enrol in the new programme, students must go to their personal page of the Teaching Portal and log in to the Apply@polito platform using the Student Number they received when they enrolled in the first programme.
 - enrol in the degree programme and declare on the Apply@polito platform that they also want to enrol in another programme (double enrolment) for which they have taken the admission test at Politecnico (see art.16).In both cases the process must be completed before the enrolment deadline following the instructions provided in the "*Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26*".
2. Applicants who have taken the TIL-I test and are awaiting the results of the admission tests to other universities must enrol at Politecnico before the deadline in order to avoid losing their place. Subsequently, if these applicants find out that they have been admitted to another university, they will be able to request a withdrawal/transfer, or declare that they want to enrol in both university programmes. **Tuition fees previously paid by these applicants will not be refunded under any circumstances.**



**Art. 16
(Double enrolment in two degree programmes)**

1. Applicants who want to simultaneously enrol in two degree programmes must refer to the rules contained in Law no. 33 of 12th April 2022 and subsequent ministerial decrees (decree no. 930 of 29th July 2022 and no. 933 of 2nd August 2022) to verify if the two programmes are compatible for double enrolment.
2. Double enrolment in two Bachelor's degree programmes of the Engineering area at Politecnico di Torino is not permitted. Double enrolment in a Bachelor's degree programmes of the Engineering area and in the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies is also not permitted. On the contrary, students are allowed to make a double enrolment in a programme of the Engineering area and in one of the programmes listed below, provided that 2/3 of the educational activities are different:

- Architettura-Architecture
- Design and Communication
- Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning.

Moreover, students are allowed to make a double enrolment in the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies and in one of the programmes listed below, provided that 2/3 of the educational activities are different:

- Architettura-Architecture
- Design and Communication
- Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning.

3. It is possible to simultaneously enrol in a degree programme at Politecnico and in a programme at another university in compliance with the law. During the application process, applicants who are already enrolled at another university are required to enter the following information on the Apply@polito platform (EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND section): university, denomination and degree class of the programme, list of the exams included in the study plan (passed and unpassed) with number of credits, Scientific and Disciplinary Field and grade (if the exam has already been taken).
4. Applicants referred to in paragraphs 2 and 3 who wish to do a double enrolment are required to take the TIL-I test and be on the ranking list. If the applicant is on the ranking list for admission to a programme at Politecnico, he/she must confirm his/her intention to enrol directly on the Apply@polito platform by paying the first instalment of the tuition fees (art. 14, paragraphs 1 and 2) before the deadlines, following the procedures for completing the enrolment process, which will be illustrated in the "Enrolment Regulations - A.Y. 2025/26" referred to in art. 14, paragraph 8. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process. After confirming the intention to enrol in the programme, the previous academic records of the applicant will be sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who will decide on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.
5. As per the "*Procedures for entry, stay and enrolment in higher education programmes of students requiring visa* - ay. 2024/2025, published at <https://www.universitaly.it/studenti-stranieri>, international students requiring visa are not allowed to enrol in two Bachelor's degree programmes in Year 1 (double enrolment) since the Universitaly portal only allows students to enrol in one programme at one Italian university.



Art. 17

(Applicants currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme and applicants with a university degree)

1. **Applicants currently enrolled at Politecnico in a Bachelor's degree programme of the Engineering area** are not allowed to register for a TIL-I test (except for the cases listed in the article 18, par. 3 and 4 and the cases listed in art. 19). If they want to register for the TIL-I test, they must request a withdrawal from studies in accordance with the procedure illustrated in the Student Guide. After receiving the withdrawal confirmation, they will be able to register for the TIL-I test from their personal page of the Teaching Portal (Apply@polito portlet). If they pass the TIL-I test and are on the ranking list for admission to a Bachelor's degree programme, they must confirm their intention to enrol on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (art. 14, par. 1 and 2). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" referred to in art. 14, par. 8. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process. After confirming their intention to enrol in the programme, the previous academic records of these applicants will be sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who will decide on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.
2. **Students currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at another Italian university** who intend to study at Politecnico **must take the TIL-I test** (also if they are attending a programme belonging to the same degree class) and conveniently place themselves on the ranking list. During the application process on the Apply@polito platform, these applicants must provide the details of their current Bachelor's studies (university, denomination and degree class of the programme, list of the exams included in the study plan (passed and unpassed) with number of credits, Scientific and Disciplinary Field and grade (if the exam has already been taken). If they are on the ranking list for admission to a Bachelor's degree programme, they must confirm their intention to transfer to Politecnico on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (14, par. 1 and 2). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" referred to in art. 14, par. 8. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process. After confirming their intention to enrol at Politecnico, the previous academic records of these applicants will be sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who will decide on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.
More information will be available in the Student Guide - a.y. 2025/26 (Transfers chapter – Transfers to Politecnico di Torino from another university). The Student Guide is going to be published in June.
3. **Applicants who are enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at another Italian university and wish to enrol also at Politecnico (double enrolment)**, must refer to the provisions of art. 16.
4. **Applicants who already have an Italian university degree** but are **not exempted from taking the TIL-I test** within the meaning of art. 13 must take the TIL-I test. If they pass it and are on the ranking list for admission, they must follow the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" (art. 14, par. 8). They must also comply with the terms and deadlines published in the Student Guide 2025/26 – Credit Transfer chapter – Credit transfer for Bachelor's degree programmes.
5. **Applicants with an Italian university degree** who are **exempted from taking the TIL-I test** within the meaning of art. 13, par. 3 must follow the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" (art. 14, par. 8). They must also comply with the terms and deadlines published in the Student Guide 2025/26 – Credit Transfer chapter – Credit transfer for Bachelor's degree programmes.



Art. 18 (Internal transfers)

1. Internal transfers from a Bachelor's degree programme of the Engineering area to another programme of the same area, including the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies, (except for the provisions of par. 2 and 3), are always possible with no limitation of places, as long as the student has earned at least 26 credits in the first-year subjects by the end of the September 2025 examination session. The requirements and terms for internal transfers will be illustrated in the Student Guide 2025/26 – Internal Transfers chapter.
2. Internal transfers from any Bachelor's degree programme of the Engineering area to the Bachelor's degree programmes in Computer Engineering or Aerospace Engineering are allowed only if new places become available for year 2 (based on the numbers of students admitted in a.y. 2024/2025). If the number of transfer applications is higher than the number of places available, allocations will be based on a merit ranking list. For this reason, Politecnico cannot guarantee that all applicants will be able to transfer to the new programme. The requirements and terms for internal transfers will be illustrated in the Student Guide 2025/26 – Internal Transfers chapter.
3. Students who wish to make an internal transfer to the Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Production Engineering must take and pass an admission test. Students are allowed to take the TIL-I test even if they are currently enrolled in another programme (with an active student status). If they pass the test and are on the ranking list for admission to the new Bachelor's degree programme, they must confirm their intention to transfer on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (art. 14, par. 1 and 2). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" (art. 14, par. 8). Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process.
4. Students enrolled in the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies who wish to transfer to any other programme of the Engineering area or to the programme in Architecture, Design or Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning are required to take the TIL-I test. If they pass the test and are on the ranking list for admission to the programme they have chosen, they must confirm their intention to transfer on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (art. 14, par. 1 and 2). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" (art. 14, par. 8). Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process.
5. Applicants currently enrolled at Politecnico in the Bachelor's degree programmes in Architecture or Design or Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning who intend to transfer to a programme of the Engineering area or to the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies must take the TIL-I test and conveniently place themselves on the ranking list. When these applicants register for the TIL- I test on the Apply@polito platform from their personal page, they must select the programme they want to transfer to. This choice cannot be modified. If they pass the test and are on the ranking list for admission to the Bachelor's degree programme they would like to transfer to, they must confirm their intention to transfer on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (art. 14, par. 1 and 2). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" (art. 14, par. 8). Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process.

Art. 19

(Students who are going to incur in forfeiture/ forfeited students)

1. The students who are currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at Politecnico di Torino who will incur in automatic forfeiture on 1st October 2025 and the students who forfeited in previous academic years are allowed to re-enrol in the same Bachelor's degree programme (if still offered) or in an equivalent programme without retaking the admission test. When specific national or Polito regulations impose a compulsory admission test this rule does not apply. The equivalence among degree programmes can be checked in this [table](https://www.istruzione.it/archivio/web/universita/equipollenze-titoli.html) of the Ministry of University and Research which compares educational qualifications (<https://www.istruzione.it/archivio/web/universita/equipollenze-titoli.html>).
2. If the Bachelor's degree programme from which a student has forfeited is no longer offered by Politecnico, he/she must register for the TIL-I test on the Apply@polito platform in compliance with the deadlines (art. 3, par.1) and procedures (art. 4, par.2) of this Call.
3. Forfeited students who wish to enrol in a new Bachelor's degree programme of the Engineering area offered by Politecnico di Torino must take the TIL-I test in compliance with the deadlines (art. 3, par. 1) and procedures (art. 4, par.2) of this Call.
4. More information will be available in the Student Guide a.y. 2025/26 ("Interruption, Suspension, Withdrawal, Forfeiture" chapter). The Student Guide is going to be published in June 2025.

Art. 23 (Privacy policy)

1. In accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (EU Regulation 2016/679 – GDPR) and the “Code on the protection of personal data” (D.R. no.196 of 30th June 2003 and further amendments), Politecnico di Torino (Data Controller) shall process applicants' personal data exclusively in pursuit of its institutional aims and for the transparency purposes imposed by the law. 4. Having considered recent trends and the number of withdrawals which have taken place before 31st October in the latest academic years, the number of student places that can be assigned for each programme could be higher than the number of places illustrated in Annex A referred to in par. 1.
5. Applicants can register for the admission test (art. 3 and 4) on the Apply@polito platform starting from **Tuesday 28th January 2025**.

Art. 2
(Admission requirements)

1. The requirements for admission to the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication for a.y. 2025/26 are the following:
 - passing the admission test (TIL-D / Test in Laib – Design) in accordance with the grades and thresholds illustrated in art. 7;
 - meeting the enrolment requirements of Annex A "*Requirements for enrolment in the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication for a.y. 2025/26*";
 - meeting the specific requirements of Annex B "*Specific requirements for UK, Scottish, US high school diplomas and International Baccalaureate Diploma - a.y. 2025/26*".
2. Admissions to the Bachelor's degree programmes referred to in this article are subject to prior accreditation of the programmes themselves pursuant to current legislation.
3. The score obtained by the applicants in the TIL-D test is only valid for enrolment in academic year 2025/2026. For this reason, when applicants register for the TIL-D test, they must be attending their last year of high school (i.e. they should be getting their high



- school diploma in the summer of 2025 according to the Italian school calendar) or they must have already earned their high school diploma.
4. For admissions to all Bachelor's degree programme, non-EU applicants residing abroad and requiring visa (art.1, par. 3) who come from countries with a school system that allows children to start school earlier and get their high school diploma before the age of 18, must necessarily be 17 years old when they obtain their entry visa for study purposes.

Art. 3 (Admission test dates and registration time frames)

1. **All applicants are required to take the TIL-D test in person at Politecnico.** The following table illustrates the calendar of TIL-D tests. There is a specific registration time frame for each test session.

The following table illustrates the calendar of TIL-D tests delivered in the **computer labs (LAIB)** of the main campus and of the Mondovì campus is illustrated below.

- Applicants are allowed to register for a TIL-D session until all places are filled up. If a TIL session is filled up, applicants can register for the next session. The last session is scheduled on:
 - Friday 9th May 2025** for non-EU applicants living abroad and requiring visa;
 - Friday 29th August 2025** for EU applicants and Equivalent applicants.
- Applicants are allowed to take the TIL test for a maximum of 3 times totally, but only one time per session.** If an applicant takes the test more than once, Politecnico will consider the **highest score obtained by the applicant** in the various tests. Applicants are not allowed to cancel their registration from a test date after registering to it. If a test is declared invalid due to the applicant's incorrect behaviour (see art. 8), the test will in any case count towards the three possible attempts.
- Applicants are not allowed to register for more than one test date at the same time.** They can register for a new test date exclusively after taking the test for which they have already registered.
- If an applicant has already registered for a certain test date, the system will not allow the applicant to register for a new test date scheduled before.
- Applicants are allowed to choose the time slot they prefer among the available time slots. After paying the registration fee, applicants will be able to see the exact location of the test (laib) on their personal page of the Apply@polito platform.

Art. 4

(How to register for and take the TIL-D test)

- All applicants are required to apply for the TIL-D test by registering online on the Apply@polito platform. To complete their application, applicants are also required to pay the registration fee referred to in the next paragraphs 2 and 3.
- The TIL-D registration fee is € 50.00. **The amount paid cannot be reimbursed under any circumstances**, nor can it be considered valid for TIL sessions other than the one for which the applicant has registered.
- Payment methods are the following:
 - credit cards (or other payment methods available on the PagoPA platform) generating **immediate payment** and **registration confirmation**;



- b. pre-printed notice of payment (MAV on the PagoPA platform), generating a **deferred payment**. In this case the applicant's successful registration for the test will be confirmed after Politecnico receives the payment confirmation from its bank. If an applicant does not pay by the deadline indicated in the notice of payment, the registration for the test will not be confirmed.
4. We recommend all applicants to start the above-mentioned procedures well in advance of the deadlines in order to avoid that possible technical problems may hinder to complete the process.

Art. 5

(How to register for and take the TIL-D test – applicants with disabilities or with Specific Learning Disorders)

1. In person TIL-D tests are organized in compliance with current legislation on disabilities and specific learning disorders. The procedures to take the TIL-D test for the applicants referred to in this paragraph are illustrated in the present Call. Applicants can request more information on the special arrangements provided to applicants with disabilities and specific learning disorders to the Special Needs Unit of Politecnico di Torino (<https://www.polito.it/en/education/services-and-life-at-politecnico/welcome-inclusion-and-support/inclusive-teaching>) by sending a ticket through the Ticketing Support System.
In particular, for organizational purposes:
 - applicants with disabilities or with an invalidity certificate (art. 16 of Law no.104/92) must present **a valid certificate issued by the local medical board specifying the type of disability and/or the degree of invalidity** at least 15 days before the TIL-D test date.
 - applicants with disabilities or certified specific learning disorders (SpLD), referred to in Law no. 170/2010, must present **a valid certificate issued not later than 3 years ago (if the certificate was released before turning 18 years old) by the Italian Health Care System (SSN) or by a specialist or by a health care facility recognized by the Italian system**. The certificate must be presented at least 15 days before the TIL-D test date.
 - applicants with disabilities or specific learning disorders (SpLD) who reside abroad and intend to request special arrangements for the TIL-D test must present a certificate of disability or SpLD issued in their country. These documents must be official documents stamped by the issuing institution, signed by an official of the institution and written in one of the following languages: Italian, English, French, Spanish. For documents written in other languages, applicants must provide both the original document and its translation into Italian or English in a single file. The university bodies in charge of examining the above-mentioned certificates will verify if the foreign documents provide evidence of a disability or a SpLD accepted by Italian law.
2. Applicants with a valid certificate have the right to get extra time to complete the test (up to 30% extra time for applicants with SpLD, up to 50% extra time for applicants with disabilities) and are allowed to use a non-programmable calculator.
3. Applicants who need other kinds of arrangements (such as the help of a tutor to use the PC for applicants with visual impairment or with upper limb motor impairment, or the help of a sign language interpreter) must inform the Special Needs Unit by ticket with adequate prior notice and in any case no later than 15 days before the test. Considering that organizing such special arrangements requires time, late requests may not be considered.
4. To make the TIL-D test more accessible, applicants can make use of the "ReadSpeaker" to listen to the audio descriptions of the texts. Applicants are required to use their own devices (headphones with USB port). Applicants should also bring their own calculator.
5. Applicants referred to in this article must **upload their certificate of disability/ SpLD to the Apply@polito platform** ("Personal information" section) **no later than 15 days before the date of the TIL-D test**.
6. The Special Needs Unit of Politecnico di Torino will check the certificates which must comply with the requirements listed in paragraph 1.



Art. 6 (TIL-D contents)

1. The TIL-D test is an individual test, available in Italian, which is different for each applicant. It is made up of automatically and randomly selected computer interface questions. All tests have an equivalent level of difficulty.
2. The TIL-D test consists of 42 questions, divided into 4 sections, with a predetermined number of questions to be finished within a pre-set time:
 - 12 Logic and Mathematics questions in 30 minutes;
 - 6 Reading comprehension questions in 12 minutes;
 - 12 General knowledge questions in 24 minutes;
 - 12 Design knowledge questions in 24 minutes.The total time for the TIL-D test is set at one hour and thirty minutes.
Each question has 5 possible answers marked with the letters A, B, C, D, E, only one of which is correct.

Art. 7 (Test evaluation and admission thresholds)

1. The result of each individual test is determined as follows:
 - 1 point for each correct answer
 - 0 points for each unanswered question
 - A penalty of 0.25 points (-0.25) for each incorrect questionThe score is converted to hundredths and rounded up to the second decimal position.
At the end of the test, applicants will be able to see their score on the screen. Moreover, the test result will be available in the applicant personal page of the Apply@polito platform.
2. Applicants, including applicants admitted to Politecnico, who score less than 3,6/12 in the Logics and Mathematics section (which corresponds to less than 30% of the maximum score for the section) will have to fulfil some supplementary academic obligations (in Italian, *Obblighi Formativi Aggiuntivi - OFA*). In particular:
 - they will be invited to attend tutoring math classes during Year 1;
 - they will be required to attend a course called «C.I.A.O. - Corso Interattivo di Accompagnamento Online» (online interactive support course). This course is normally offered in the week before the beginning of classes. It seeks to help applicants fill in the gaps in their Math knowledge through specific online tutoring sessions.More details on this course will be available in the applicant's personal page of the Apply@polito platform, under the "TIL-D" section.
The Student Guide and the Teaching Regulations of the Bachelor's degree programme will explain how students can fulfil their OFA.
3. The **minimum thresholds for being included in the ranking lists** for admission is **30/100**.
4. The **guaranteed admission threshold** is **70/100**. This score enables applicants to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in **Design and Communication**.

Art. 8 (Cases in which the test is declared invalid)

1. During the in-person test applicants must abide by the following conduct rules, otherwise the test may be declared invalid:
 - be absolutely silent during the test, except when they need to ask a question to test supervisor.
 - exclusively make use of the blank sheets of paper and the pen/pencil provided by Supervision Committee;
 - it is forbidden to make use of personal materials such as sheets of paper, notebooks,



notes, calculators, earphones or headphones (except for applicants entitled to extra time – art. 5) or other materials including mobile phones and smartwatches which **must remain switched off** at all times and must be placed on the desk; moreover, in compliance with art. 13 of D.P.R. 487 of 1994, “if the mobile phone emits any kind of sound during the test (alarms, wake up alarms, vibrations or other), the applicant will be invited to leave the classroom and will be excluded from the selection process with no exceptions”.

2. When the test is declared invalid due to a violation of the conduct rules referred to in the previous paragraph, the applicant is not entitled to get any refund for the registration fee.
3. If a test is declared invalid due to incorrect behaviour, the test will in any case count towards the three possible attempts.

Art. 9 (Progetto Orientamento Formativo)

1. Applicants who have taken part in the Project "Progetto Orientamento Formativo" and are eligible to take the admission test can choose to take it in one of the sessions listed in the table of art. 3 without paying the registration fee.
2. If these applicants want to retake the TIL-D test, they are allowed to retake it 2 more times. In this case they must pay the registration fee in full (art. 4, par. 2). Politecnico will consider the **highest score** obtained by the applicant in all the tests.
3. Applicants who are participating in the "Progetto Orientamento" must strictly abide by the general procedures illustrated in this Call.

Art. 10 (TIL-D results and date of publication of the ranking list)

1. The TIL-D results are divided in two groups (EU/equivalent applicants and non-EU applicants requiring visa) and they are made public through the publication of:
 - the list of the applicants who have scored higher than or equal to the guaranteed admission threshold (art. 7, par. 4). This score enables applicants to reserve their student place/enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication. This list will be published **after each TIL-D session**. Successful applicants will be able to reserve their student place/enrol only after the test has been checked against irregularities by the Central Committee within three working days of the test date; if the test is declared invalid, the applicant will receive a mail (pec);
 - a merit-based ranking list for the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication for the allocation of residual student places. This ranking list includes the applicants who are exempted from taking the admission test (art. 13, par. 1) and the applicants who have scored higher than or equal to the guaranteed admission threshold.

The ranking lists will be published on:

 - a) **Tuesday 20th May 2025** for non-EU applicants residing abroad and requiring visa
 - b) **Thursday 4th September 2025** for EU applicants and Equivalent applicants.
2. The above-mentioned ranking lists will be published in the online Bulletin (Albo online) and/or at this link. [Calls for applications](#).
3. The “Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025-26” - which will be published on the university website by **Thursday 27th March 2025** (enrolment opening date) - will illustrate the cases in which applicants need to reserve their student place before enrolling. The “Enrolment regulations” will be published on Polito website in the “[Calls for applications, Regulations and Ranking lists](#)” section.



Art. 11

(List of applicants who scored higher than the guaranteed admission threshold and ranking lists)

1. The applicants who have scored higher than or equal to the guaranteed admission threshold are entitled to reserve their student place /enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication.
2. The ranking lists are made with the following criteria:
 - a. applicants are ranked in descending order based on their TIL-D score;
 - b. in case of equal ranking, the score obtained in the individual sections that make up the TIL-D test shall prevail, considered in the following order: Design knowledge, Logic and Mathematics, Reading comprehension and General knowledge. In case of a further equal ranking, the younger applicant will be chosen.
3. The ranking lists classify prospective students into the following categories:
 - ENROLLED STUDENT WITH INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE: a student who has got a valid international certificate (see art. 13, par. 1) and has already enrolled;
 - ASSIGNED STUDENT WITH INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE: a student with a valid international certificate who **MUST** reserve his/her student place/enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme assigned to him/her before the deadline for the update of the ranking list (see art. 14);
 - ENROLLED STUDENT: a student who has reserved his/her student place or has completed the online enrolment process (see art. 14);
 - ASSIGNED STUDENT: a student who **MUST** reserve his/her student place or enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme assigned to him/her before the deadline for the update of the ranking list (see art. 14); failure to reserve the student place/enrol by the deadline will result in the allocation of his/her place to another applicant – **therefore, failure to reserve one's student place/enrol by the deadline in accordance with art. 14 entails permanent renunciation of the place.**
 - STUDENT ON WAITING LIST: a student who has not been offered a place in any Bachelor's degree programme chosen during the application process, but could be offered a place in a non-saturated degree programme in the next call/s if another student with a better score on the ranking list decides to renounce the right to enrol. This student must wait for the next the call/s.
 - WAITING LIST RENUNCIATION: a student who has explicitly renounced his/her right to be on the waiting list (art. 12, par. 2).
 - ENROLMENT RENUNCIATION:
 - a student who has been ASSIGNED a place but has failed to reserve his/her student place / enrol by the deadline;
 - a student who has ENROLLED in the programme but has withdrawn from it before the closing date of the ranking list/ before the update of the ranking list referred in art. 12, par. 3 and in art 14, par. 1.
 - NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO UNFULFILLED LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS: a student who has correctly reserved his/her student place but is not allowed to enrol since he/she does not meet the language requirements illustrated in Annex A to this Call.
 - NOT ADMITTED STUDENT: a student who has not reached the minimum admission threshold.
 - NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO FILLED UP PROGRAMME: a student who cannot be assigned a place because the Bachelor's degree programme is filled up (as per art.1, par. 1 of this Call);
 - NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO CLOSED RANKING LISTS: a student who has not been admitted since the ranking lists were already closed when he/she decided to enrol (see art. 12, par. 3).



**Art. 12
(How the ranking lists are updated)**

1. Allocations of places to the applicants included in the ranking lists are based on the updates of the ranking lists which depend on the number of students who reserve their place and enrol online before the deadlines of art. 14.
2. The applicants included in the ranking lists who are no longer interested in enrolling at Politecnico di Torino and **intend to renounce their right to be on the waiting list**, are kindly invited to communicate this decision to Politecnico through the Apply@polito platform; **when an applicant renounces his/her right to be on the waiting list, he/she irrevocably gives up his/her position on the ranking list**; therefore his/her student place is assigned to another applicant on the ranking list.
3. The **ranking lists will be closed** on:
 - a. **Friday 27th June 2025** for non-EU applicants residing abroad and requiring visa;
 - b. **Tuesday 21st October 2025** for EU applicants and Equivalent applicants;**Enrolment will no longer be possible after the closing date of the ranking lists.**

**Art. 13
(Exemptions from the TIL-D test)**

1. Upon specific request, applicants may be exempted from taking the TIL-D test if they have the **SAT certificate, recognized as equivalent to passing the TIL-D test** (score equal to or higher than the guaranteed admission threshold) according to the following specifications:

<u>Certificate</u>	<u>Required scores</u>
<u>SAT</u>	SAT (section "Evidence-Based Reading and Writing and Math" with a minimum score of 650 points in each section). Upon registration for the SAT test, applicants must ask the Examination Board (College Board) to automatically send the certificate to Politecnico di Torino (institution code: 7679)

2. To be exempted from the TIL-D test, applicants are required to:
 - Fill out the specific section on the Apply@polito platform with the details of the certificate **not later than Monday 7th April 2025**. The **outcome** of the verification process will be communicated via e-mail **by Thursday 24th April 2024**.
 - ask the Examination Board (College Board) to send the certificate to Politecnico di Torino for verification by **Monday 7th April 2025**.
3. The applicants who have already forfeited from studies or will incur in forfeiture (according to art. 18, par. 1) are also exempted from taking the TIL-D test.



**Art. 14
(Enrolment requirements and process)**

1. All applicants are strictly required to meet the deadlines illustrated in the table below. Failure to meet these deadlines entails permanent exclusion from the enrolment process.

The standard amount of the first instalment is 161€. Possible reductions or revisions of this amount will be announced in the Tuition Fee Guide for academic year 2025/2026, which is going to be approved by the university bodies at a later date.
- The procedure for student place reservation/enrolment referred to in the previous paragraph (including the payment of the first instalment) must be completed also by the students who are simultaneously enrolled in another university programme, in accordance with Law no. 33 of 12th April 2022.



4. The enrolment requirements are listed in Annex A and in Annex B.
5. **Applicants with a non-Italian educational qualification must meet the language requirements of Annex A by:**
 - a. **Friday 9th May 2025** for non-EU applicants living abroad and requiring visa;
 - b. **Friday 29th August 2025** for EU applicant and Equivalent applicants.Before this deadline, applicants are required to fill in the "Language skills" section of the Apply@polito platform entering the information on their Italian language certificate required for admission.
6. Applicants who have reserved their student place and meet the language requirements (art. 5 of the present article – applicants with non-Italian educational qualification) must enrol online by Tuesday **30th September 2025 at 2.00 p.m.** In the event of further updates of the ranking lists (par.2) and consequent new offers of admission, a new enrolment deadline will be announced and published on the applicant's personal page of the Apply@polito platform.
7. **Applicants who do not meet the deadlines of this article or the admission requirements listed in Annex A and Annex B** lose their right to enrol at Politecnico and will **not be entitled to ask for refund of the first instalment of the tuition fees**, no matter the justification brought forward.
8. **The general instructions for enrolment** will be illustrated in the "*Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26*" which are going to be published by Thursday 27th March 2025 (enrolment opening date).

Art. 15

(Applicants who take more than one admission test)

1. Applicants who have taken more than one admission test for different Bachelor's degree programmes offered by Politecnico may be eligible for enrolment in the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication and at the same time they may be on a waiting list for other programmes (Engineering, Architecture, Planning and Industrial Manufacturing Technologies). In this case, they must reserve their student place or enrol in the programme in Design and Communication before the deadline in order to avoid losing the place. Subsequently, if they find out that they have been admitted to another programme (Engineering, Architecture, Planning and Industrial Manufacturing Technologies) and they prefer to enrol in that programme, they will have to choose one of the following options using the online system:
 - withdraw from the Bachelor's degree programme in which they have enrolled ("withdrawal from studies"), following these steps:
 - a. fill out an online form available on their personal page of the Teaching Portal.
 - b. pay 16.00 Euro for the virtual revenue stamp required for the withdrawal (this amount must be paid from the personal page of the Teaching Portal).
 - c. enrol in the new Bachelor's degree programme after they receive the withdrawal confirmation (an e-mail confirming their withdrawal will be sent to their Polito mailbox). To enrol in the new programme, students must go to their personal page of the Teaching Portal and log in to the Apply@polito platform using the Student Number they received when they enrolled in the first programme.
 - enrol in the degree programme and declare on the Apply@polito platform that they also want to enrol in another programme (double enrolment) for which they have taken the admission test at Politecnico (see art.16).In both cases the process must be completed before the enrolment deadline following the instructions provided in the "*Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26*".
2. Applicants who have taken the TIL-D test and are awaiting the results of the admission tests to other universities must enrol at Politecnico before the deadline in order to avoid losing their place. Subsequently, if these applicants find out that they have been admitted to another university, they will be able to request a withdrawal/transfer, or



declare that they want to enrol in both university programmes. **Tuition fees previously paid by these applicants will not be refunded under any circumstances.**

**Art. 16
(Double enrolment in two degree programmes)**

1. Applicants who want to simultaneously enrol in two degree programmes must refer to the rules contained in Law no. 33 of 12th April 2022 and subsequent ministerial decrees (decree no. 930 of 29th July 2022 and no. 933 of 2nd August 2022) to verify if the two programmes are compatible for double enrolment.
2. Provided that 2/3 of the courses are different among the two programmes, applicants are allowed to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication and in one of the following programmes (double enrolment):
 - Architettura-Architecture
 - Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning
 - Any Bachelor's degree programme of the Engineering area, including the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies.
3. It is possible to simultaneously enrol in a degree programme at Politecnico and in a programme at another university in compliance with the law. During the application process, applicants who are already enrolled at another university are required to enter the following information on the Apply@polito platform (EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND section): university, denomination and degree class of the programme, list of the exams included in the study plan (passed and unpassed) with number of credits, Scientific and Disciplinary Field and grade (if the exam has already been taken).
4. Applicants referred to in paragraphs 2 and 3 who wish to do a double enrolment are required to take the TIL-D test and be on the ranking list.

If the applicant is on the ranking list for admission to a programme at Politecnico, he/she must confirm his/her intention to enrol directly on the Apply@polito platform by paying the first instalment of the tuition fees (art. 14, paragraphs 1 and 2) before the deadlines, following the procedures for completing the enrolment process, which will be illustrated in the "Enrolment Regulations - A.Y. 2025/26" referred to in art. 14, paragraph 8. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process. After confirming the intention to enrol in the programme, the previous academic records of the applicant will be sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who will decide on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.
5. As per the "*Procedures for entry, stay and enrolment in higher education programmes of students requiring visa - ay. 2024/2025*" published at <https://www.universitaly.it/studenti-stranieri>, international students requiring visa are not allowed to enrol in two Bachelor's degree programmes in Year 1 (double enrolment) since the Universitaly portal only allows students to enrol in one programme at one Italian university.

**Art. 17
(Applicants currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme
and applicants with a university degree)**

1. **Applicants currently enrolled at Politecnico in a Bachelor's degree programme** who wish to transfer to the programme in Design and Communication must take and pass the TIL-D test. During the registration for the TIL-D test, they must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication in the "Select your programme" section of the Apply@polito platform. This choice cannot be modified.

If they **pass the TIL-D test and are on the ranking list** for admission, they must confirm their intention to enrol on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (art. 14, par. 1 and 2). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" referred to in art. 14, par. 8. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process.



2. **Students currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at another Italian university** who intend to enrol at Politecnico in the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication **must take the TIL-D test** (also if they are attending a programme belonging to the same degree class) and conveniently place themselves on the ranking list. During the registration for the TIL-D test, they must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication in the "Select your programme" section of the Apply@polito platform. During the application process on the Apply@polito platform, these applicants must provide the details of their current Bachelor's studies university, denomination and degree class of the programme, list of the exams included in the study plan (passed and unpassed) with number of credits, Scientific and Disciplinary Field and grade (if the exam has already been taken).
If they are on the ranking list for admission, they must confirm their intention to transfer to Politecnico on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (14, par. 1 and 2). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" referred to in art. 14, par. 8. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process. After confirming their intention to enrol at Politecnico, the previous academic records of these applicants will be sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who will decide on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.
More information will be available in the Student Guide - a.y. 2025/26 (Transfers chapter – Transfers to Politecnico di Torino from another university). The Student Guide is going to be published in June.
3. **Applicants who are enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at another Italian university** and who wish to enrol also at Politecnico (double enrolment), must refer to the provisions of art. 16.
4. Applicants who already have an Italian university degree but are **not exempted from taking the TIL-D test** within the meaning of art. 13 must take the TIL-D test. If they pass it and are on the ranking list for admission, they must follow the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" (art. 14, par. 8). They must also comply with the terms and deadlines published in the Student Guide 2025/26 – Credit Transfer chapter – Credit transfer for Bachelor's degree programmes.
5. **Applicants with an Italian university degree**, must follow the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" (art. 14, par. 8). They must also comply with the terms and deadlines published in the Student Guide 2025/26 – Credit Transfer chapter – Credit transfer for Bachelor's degree programmes

Art. 18

(Students who are going to incur in forfeiture/ forfeited students)

1. The students currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at Politecnico di Torino who will incur in automatic forfeiture on 1st October 2025 and the students who forfeited in previous academic years are allowed to re-enrol in the same Bachelor's degree programme (if still offered) or in an equivalent programme without retaking the admission test. When specific national or Polito regulations impose a compulsory admission test this rule does not apply. The equivalence among degree programmes can be checked in this [table](https://www.istruzione.it/archivio/web/universita/equipollenze-titoli.html) of the Ministry of University and Research which compare educational qualifications (<https://www.istruzione.it/archivio/web/universita/equipollenze-titoli.html>).
2. If the Bachelor's degree programme from which students have forfeited is no longer offered by Politecnico, the students who wish to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication must register for the TIL-D test on the Apply@polito platform in compliance with the deadlines of art. 3, par. 1. They must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication in the "Select your programme" section. This choice cannot be modified.



3. The students who have forfeited from a Polito Bachelor's degree programme other than Design and Communication who wish to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication must register for the TIL-D test on the Apply@polito platform in compliance with the deadlines of art. 3, par.1. They must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Design and Communication in the "Select your programme" section. This choice cannot be modified.
4. More information will be available in the Student Guide a.y. 2025/26 ("Interruption, Suspension, Withdrawal, Forfeiture" chapter). The Student Guide is going to be published in June 2025.

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Art. 1
(Initiation of the procedure and places available)

1. Applications are invited for admissions to the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning for a.y. 2025/26. Admissions are limited to the following number of student places:

2. Annexes A and B are integral parts of this Call for applications.
3. For the purposes of defining the ranking lists, the following categories have been given the following meaning:
European Union applicants: Italian citizens or other EU nationals;
Equivalent applicants:
 - applicants from Norway, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Switzerland and San Marino;
 - non-EU nationals legally residing in Italy with a valid residence permit for study, work or family reasons;
 - political refugees;
 - staff members of Foreign Diplomatic Missions (Embassies/Consulates) and International Organizations based in Italy, legally accredited to the Italian Government or to the Holy See (including family members: spouse and children);**Non-EU applicants living abroad and requiring visa**
4. Having considered recent trends and the number of withdrawals which have taken place before 31st October in the latest academic years, the number of student places that can be assigned for each programme could be higher than the number of places illustrated in Annex A referred to in par. 1.
5. Applicants can register for the admission test (art. 3 and 4) on the Apply@polito platform starting from **Tuesday 28th January 2025**.

Art. 2
(Admission requirements)

1. The requirements for admission to the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning for a.y. 2025/26 are the following:
 - passing the admission test (TIL-P / Test in Laib – Planning) in accordance with the grades and thresholds illustrated in art. 7;
 - meeting the enrolment requirements of Annex A "*Requirements for enrolment in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning for a.y. 2025/26*";
 - meeting the specific requirements of Annex B "*Specific requirements for UK, Scottish, US high school diplomas and International Baccalaureate Diploma - a.y. 2025/26*".
2. Admissions to the Bachelor's degree programmes referred to in this article are subject to prior accreditation of the programmes themselves pursuant to current legislation.



3. The score obtained by the applicants in the TIL-P test is only valid for enrolment in academic year 2025/2026. For this reason, when applicants register for the TIL-P test, they must be attending their last year of high school (i.e. they should be getting their high school diploma in the summer of 2025 according to the Italian school calendar) or they must have already earned their high school diploma.
4. For admissions to all Bachelor's degree programme, non-EU applicants residing abroad and requiring visa (art.1, par. 3) who come from countries with a school system that allows children to start school earlier and get their high school diploma before the age of 18, must necessarily be 17 years old when they obtain their entry visa for study purposes.

Art. 3 (Admission test dates and registration time frames)

1. **All applicants are required to take the TIL-P test in person at Politecnico.** The following table illustrates the calendar of TIL-P tests. There is a specific registration time frame for each test session.

- Applicants are allowed to register for a TIL-P session until all places are filled up. If a TIL session is filled up, applicants can register for the next session. The last session is scheduled on:
 - Friday 9th May 2025** for non-EU applicants living abroad and requiring visa;
 - Friday 29th August 2025** for EU applicants and Equivalent applicants.
- Applicants are allowed to take the TIL test for a maximum of 3 times totally, but only one time per session.** If an applicant takes the test more than once, Politecnico will consider the **highest score obtained by the applicant** in the various tests. Applicants are not allowed to cancel their registration from a test date after registering to it. If a test is declared invalid due to the applicant's incorrect behaviour (see art. 8), the test will in any case count towards the three possible attempts.
- Applicants are not allowed to register for more than one test date at the same time.** They can register for a new test date exclusively after taking the test for which they have already registered.
- If an applicant has already registered for a certain test date, the system will not allow the applicant to register for a new test date scheduled before.
- Applicants are allowed to choose the time slot they prefer among the available time slots. After paying the registration fee, applicants will be able to see the exact location of the test (laib) on their personal page of the Apply@polito platform.

Art. 4 (How to register for and take the TIL-P test)

- All applicants are required to apply for the TIL-P test by registering online on the Apply@polito platform. To complete their application, applicants are also required to pay the registration fee referred to in the next paragraphs 2 and 3.
- The TIL-P registration fee is € 50.00. **The amount paid cannot be reimbursed under any circumstances**, nor can it be considered valid for TIL sessions other than the one for which the applicant has registered.
- Payment methods are the following:



- a. credit cards (or other payment methods available on the PagoPA platform) generating **immediate payment** and **registration confirmation**;
 - b. pre-printed notice of payment (MAV on the PagoPA platform), generating a **deferred payment**. In this case the applicant's successful registration for the test will be confirmed after Politecnico receives the payment confirmation from its bank. If an applicant does not pay by the deadline indicated in the notice of payment, the registration for the test will not be confirmed.
4. We recommend all applicants to start the above-mentioned procedures well in advance of the deadlines in order to avoid that possible technical problems may hinder to complete the process.

Art. 5

(How to register for and take the TIL-P test – applicants with disabilities or with Specific Learning Disorders)

1. In person TIL-P tests are organized in compliance with current legislation on disabilities and specific learning disorders. The procedures to take the TIL-P test for the applicants referred to in this paragraph are illustrated in the present Call. Applicants can request more information on the special arrangements provided to applicants with disabilities and specific learning disorders to the Special Needs Unit of Politecnico di Torino (<https://www.polito.it/en/education/services-and-life-at-politecnico/welcome-inclusion-and-support/inclusive-teaching>) by sending a ticket through the Ticketing Support System.
In particular, for organizational purposes:
 - applicants with disabilities or with an invalidity certificate (art. 16 of Law no.104/92) must present **a valid certificate issued by the local medical board specifying the type of disability and/or the degree of invalidity** at least 15 days before the TIL-P test date.
 - applicants with disabilities or certified specific learning disorders (SpLD), referred to in Law no. 170/2010, must present **a valid certificate issued not later than 3 years ago (if the certificate was released before turning 18 years old) by the Italian Health Care System (SSN) or by a specialist or by an health care facility recognized by the Italian system**. The certificate must be presented at least 15 days before the TIL-P test date.
 - applicants with disabilities or specific learning disorders (SpLD) who reside abroad and intend to request special arrangements for the TIL-P test must present a certificate of disability or SpLD issued in their country. These documents must be official documents stamped by the issuing institution, signed by an official of the institution and written in one of the following languages: Italian, English, French, Spanish. For documents written in other languages, applicants must provide both the original document and its translation into Italian or English in a single file. The university bodies in charge of examining the above-mentioned certificates will verify if the foreign documents provide evidence of a disability or a SpLD accepted by Italian law.
2. Applicants with a valid certificate have the right to get extra time to complete the test (up to 30% extra time for applicants with SpLD, up to 50% extra time for applicants with disabilities) and are allowed to use a non-programmable calculator.
3. Applicants who need other kinds of arrangements (such as the help of a tutor to use the PC for applicants with visual impairment or with upper limb motor impairment, or the help of a sign language interpreter) must inform the Special Needs Unit by ticket with adequate prior notice and in any case no later than 15 days before the test. Considering that organizing such special arrangements requires time, late requests may not be considered.
4. To make the TIL-P test more accessible, applicants can make use of the "ReadSpeaker" to listen to the audio descriptions of the texts. Applicants are required to use their own devices (headphones with USB port). Applicants should also bring their own calculator.
5. Applicants referred to in this article must **upload their certificate of disability/ SpLD to the Apply@polito platform** ("Personal information" section) **no later than 15 days before the date of the TIL-P test**.



6. The Special Needs Unit of Politecnico di Torino will check the certificates which must comply with the requirements listed in paragraph 1.

Art. 6 (TIL-P contents)

1. The TIL-P test is an individual test, available in Italian, which is different for each applicant. It is made up of automatically and randomly selected computer interface questions. All tests have an equivalent level of difficulty.
2. The TIL-P test consists of 42 questions, divided into 4 sections, with a predetermined number of questions to be finished within a pre-set time:
 - 12 Logic and Mathematics questions in 30 minutes;
 - 6 Reading comprehension questions in 12 minutes;
 - 12 General knowledge questions in 24 minutes;
 - 12 Territory and society questions in 24 minutes.The total time for the TIL-P test is set at one hour and thirty minutes.
Each question has 5 possible answers marked with the letters A, B, C, D, E, only one of which is correct.

Art. 7 (Test evaluation and admission thresholds)

1. The result of each individual test is determined as follows:
 - 1 point for each correct answer
 - 0 points for each unanswered question
 - A penalty of 0.25 points (-0.25) for each incorrect questionThe score is converted to hundredths and rounded up to the second decimal position.
At the end of the test, applicants will be able to see their score on the screen. Moreover, the test result will be available in the applicant personal page of the Apply@polito platform.
2. Applicants, including applicants admitted to Politecnico, who score less than 3,6/12 in the Logics and Mathematics section (which corresponds to less than 30% of the maximum score for the section) will have to fulfil some supplementary academic obligations (in Italian, *Obblighi Formativi Aggiuntivi - OFA*). In particular:
 - they will be invited to attend tutoring math classes during Year 1;
 - they will be required to attend a course called «C.I.A.O. - Corso Interattivo di Accompagnamento Online» (online interactive support course). This course is normally offered in the week before the beginning of classes. It seeks to help applicants fill in the gaps in their Math knowledge through specific online tutoring sessions.More details on this course will be available in the applicant's personal page of the Apply@polito platform, under the "TIL-P" section.
The Student Guide and the Teaching Regulations of the Bachelor's degree programme will explain how students can fulfil their OFA.
3. The **minimum thresholds for being included in the ranking lists** for admission is **30/100**.
4. The **guaranteed admission threshold** is **60/100**. This score enables applicants to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning.

Art. 8 (Cases in which the test is declared invalid)

1. During the in-person test applicants must abide by the following conduct rules, otherwise the test may be declared invalid:
 - be absolutely silent during the test, except when they need to ask a question to test supervisor.



- exclusively make use of the blank sheets of paper and the pen/pencil provided by Supervision Committee;
 - it is forbidden to make use of personal materials such as sheets of paper, notebooks, notes, calculators, earphones or headphones (except for applicants entitled to extra time – art. 5) or other materials including mobile phones and smartwatches which **must remain switched off** at all times and must be placed on the desk; moreover, in compliance with art. 13 of D.P.R. 487 of 1994, “if the mobile phone emits any kind of sound during the test (alarms, wake up alarms, vibrations or other), the applicant will be invited to leave the classroom and will be excluded from the selection process with no exceptions”.
2. When the test is declared invalid due to a violation of the conduct rules referred to in the previous paragraph, the applicant is not entitled to get any refund for the registration fee.
 3. If a test is declared invalid due to incorrect behaviour (see art. 8), the test will in any case count towards the three possible attempts.

Art. 9

(Progetto Orientamento Formativo)

1. Applicants who have taken part in the Project "Progetto Orientamento Formativo" and are eligible to take the admission test can choose to take it in one of the sessions listed in the table of art. 3 without paying the registration fee.
2. If these applicants want to retake the TIL-P test, they are allowed to retake it 2 more times. In this case they must pay the registration fee in full (art. 4, par. 2). Politecnico will consider the **highest score** obtained by the applicant in all the tests.
3. Applicants who are participating in the "Progetto Orientamento" must strictly abide by the general procedures illustrated in this Call.

Art. 10

(TIL-P results and date of publication of the ranking list)

1. The TIL-P results are divided in two groups (EU/equivalent applicants and non-EU applicants requiring visa) and they are made public through the publication of:
 - the list of the applicants who have scored higher than or equal to the guaranteed admission threshold (art. 7, par. 4)). This score enables applicants to reserve their student place/enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning. This list will be published **after each TIL-P session**. Successful applicants will be able to reserve their student place/enrol only after the test has been checked against irregularities by the Central Committee within three working days of the test date; if the test is declared invalid, the applicant will receive a mail (pec);
 - a merit-based ranking list for the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning for the allocation of residual student places. This ranking list includes the applicants who are exempted from taking the admission test (art. 13, par. 1) and the applicants who have scored higher than or equal to the guaranteed admission threshold.

The ranking lists will be published on:

 - a) **Tuesday 20th May 2025** for non-EU applicants residing abroad and requiring visa
 - b) **Thursday 4th September 2025** for EU applicants and Equivalent applicants.
2. The above-mentioned ranking lists will be published in the online Bulletin (Albo online) and/or at this link. [Calls for applications](#).
3. The “Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025-26” - which will be published on the university website by **27th March 2025** (enrolment opening date) - will illustrate the cases in which applicants need to reserve their student place before enrolling. The “Enrolment



regulations" will be published on Polito website in the "[Calls for applications, Regulations and Ranking lists](#)" section.

Art. 11

(List of applicants who scored higher than the guaranteed admission threshold and ranking lists)

1. The applicants who have scored higher than or equal to the guaranteed admission threshold are entitled to reserve their student place /enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning.
2. The ranking lists are made with the following criteria:
 - a. applicants are ranked in descending order based on their TIL-P score;
 - b. in case of equal ranking, the score obtained in the individual sections that make up the TIL-P test shall prevail, considered in the following order: Territory and society, Logic and Mathematics, Reading comprehension and General knowledge. In case of a further equal ranking, the younger applicant will be chosen.
3. The ranking lists classify prospective students into the following categories:
 - ENROLLED STUDENT WITH INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE: a student who has got a valid international certificate (see art. 13, par. 1) and has already enrolled;
 - ASSIGNED STUDENT WITH INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE: a student with a valid international certificate who **MUST** reserve his/her student place/enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme assigned to him/her before the deadline for the update of the ranking list (see art. 14);
 - ENROLLED STUDENT: a student who has reserved his/her student place or has completed the online enrolment process (see art. 14);
 - ASSIGNED STUDENT: a student who **MUST** reserve his/her student place or enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme assigned to him/her before the deadline for the update of the ranking list (see art. 14); failure to reserve the student place/enrol by the deadline will result in the allocation of his/her place to another applicant – **therefore, failure to reserve one's student place/enrol by the deadline in accordance with art. 14 entails permanent renunciation of the place.**
 - STUDENT ON WAITING LIST: a student who has not been offered a place in any Bachelor's degree programme chosen during the application process, but could be offered a place in a non-saturated degree programme in the next call/s if another student with a better score on the ranking list decides to renounce the right to enrol. This student must wait for the next the call/s.
 - WAITING LIST RENUNCIATION: a student who has explicitly renounced his/her right to be on the waiting list (art. 12, par. 2).
 - ENROLMENT RENUNCIATION:
 - a student who has been ASSIGNED a place but has failed to reserve his/her student place / enrol by the deadline;
 - a student who has ENROLLED in the programme but has withdrawn from it before the closing date of the ranking list/ before the update of the ranking list referred in art. 12, par. 3 and in art 14, par. 1.
 - NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO UNFULFILLED LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS: a student who has correctly reserved his/her student place but is not allowed to enrol since he/she does not meet the language requirements illustrated in Annex A to this Call.
 - NOT ADMITTED STUDENT: a student who has not reached the minimum admission threshold.
 - NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO FILLED UP PROGRAMME: a student who cannot be assigned a place because the Bachelor's degree programme is filled up (as per art.1, par. 1 of this Call);
 - NOT ADMITTED STUDENT DUE TO CLOSED RANKING LISTS: a student who has not been admitted since the ranking lists were already closed when he/she decided to enrol (see art. 12, par. 3).



**Art. 12
(How the ranking lists are updated)**

1. Allocations of places to the applicants included in the ranking lists are based on the updates of the ranking lists which depend on the number of students who reserve their place and enrol online before the deadlines of art. 14.
2. The applicants included in the ranking lists who are no longer interested in enrolling at Politecnico di Torino and **intend to renounce their right to be on the waiting list**, are kindly invited to communicate this decision to Politecnico through the Apply@polito platform; **when an applicant renounces his/her right to be on the waiting list, he/she irrevocably gives up his/her position on the ranking list**; therefore his/her student place is assigned to another applicant on the ranking list.
3. The ranking lists will be closed on:
 - a. **Friday 27th June 2025** for non-EU applicants residing abroad and requiring visa;
 - b. **Tuesday 21st October 2025** for EU applicants and Equivalent applicants;**Enrolment will no longer be possible after the closing date of the ranking lists.**

**Art. 13
(Exemptions from the TIL-P test)**

1. Upon specific request, applicants may be exempted from taking the TIL-P test if they have the **SAT certificate, recognized as equivalent to passing the TIL-P test** (score equal to or higher than the guaranteed admission threshold) according to the following specifications:

<u>SAT</u>	SAT (section "Evidence-Based Reading and Writing and Math" with a minimum score of 650 points in each section). Upon registration for the SAT test, applicants must ask the Examination Board (College Board) to automatically send the certificate to Politecnico di Torino (institution code: 7679)

2. To be exempted from the TIL-P test, applicants are required to:
 - Fill out the specific section on the Apply@polito platform with the details of the certificate **not later than Monday 7th April 2025**. The **outcome** of the verification process will be communicated via e-mail **by Thursday 24th April 2024**.
 - ask the Examination Board (College Board) to send the certificate to Politecnico di Torino for verification by **Monday 7th April 2025**.
3. The applicants who have already forfeited from studies or will incur in forfeiture (according to art. 18, par. 1) are also exempted from taking the TIL-P test.



**Art. 14
(Enrolment requirements and process)**

1. All applicants are strictly required to meet the deadlines illustrated in the table below. Failure to meet these deadlines entails permanent exclusion from the enrolment process.

 - b. **Friday 29th August 2025** for EU applicant and Equivalent applicants.Before this deadline, applicants are required to fill in the "Language skills" section of the Apply@polito platform entering the information on their Italian language certificate required for admission.
6. Applicants who have reserved their student place and meet the language requirements (art. 5 of the present article – applicants with non-Italian educational qualification) must enrol online **by Tuesday 30th September 2025 at 2.00 p.m.** In the event of further updates of the ranking lists (par.2) and consequent new offers of admission, a new enrolment deadline will be announced and published on the applicant's personal page of the Apply@polito platform.
7. **Applicants who do not meet the deadlines of this article or the admission requirements listed in Annex A and Annex B** lose their right to enrol at Politecnico and will **not be entitled to ask for refund of the first instalment of the tuition fees**, no matter the justification brought forward.
8. **The general instructions for enrolment** will be illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" which are going to be published by **Thursday 27th March 2025** (enrolment opening date).

Art. 15

(Applicants who take more than one admission test)

1. Applicants who have taken more than one admission test for different Bachelor's degree programmes offered by Politecnico may be eligible for enrolment in the Bachelor's degree programme in Planning and Industrial Manufacturing Technologies and at the same time they may be on a waiting list for other programmes (Engineering, Architecture, Design and Communication). In this case, they must reserve their student place or enrol in the programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning before the deadline in order to avoid losing the place. Subsequently, if they find out that they have been admitted to another programme (Engineering, Architecture, Planning and Industrial Manufacturing Technologies) and they prefer to enrol in that programme, they will have to choose one of the following options using the online system:
 - withdraw from the Bachelor's degree programme in which they have enrolled ("withdrawal from studies"), following these steps:
 - a. fill out an online form available on their personal page of the Teaching Portal.
 - b. pay 16.00 Euro for the virtual revenue stamp required for the withdrawal (this amount must be paid from the personal page of the Teaching Portal).
 - c. enrol in the new Bachelor's degree programme after they receive the withdrawal confirmation (an e-mail confirming their withdrawal will be sent to their Polito mailbox). To enrol in the new programme, students must go to their personal page of the Teaching Portal and log in to the Apply@polito platform using the Student Number they received when they enrolled in the first programme.
 - enrol in the degree programme and declare on the Apply@polito platform that they also want to enrol in another programme (double enrolment) for which they have taken the admission test at Politecnico (see art.16).In both cases the process must be completed before the enrolment deadline following the instructions provided in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26".
2. Applicants who have taken the TIL-P test and are awaiting the results of the admission tests to other universities must enrol at Politecnico before the deadline in order to avoid losing their place. Subsequently, if these applicants find out that they have been admitted to another university, they will be able to request a withdrawal/transfer, or



declare that they want to enrol in both university programmes. **Tuition fees previously paid by these applicants will not be refunded under any circumstances.**

**Art. 16
(Double enrolment in two degree programmes)**

1. Applicants who want to simultaneously enrol in two degree programmes must refer to the rules contained in Law no. 33 of 12th April 2022 and subsequent ministerial decrees (decree no. 930 of 29th July 2022 and no. 933 of 2nd August 2022) to verify if the two programmes are compatible for double enrolment.
2. Provided that 2/3 of the courses are different among the two programmes, applicants are allowed to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning and in one of the following programmes (double enrolment):
 - Architettura-Architecture
 - Design and Communication
 - Any Bachelor's degree programme of the Engineering area, including the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies.
3. It is possible to simultaneously enrol in a degree programme at Politecnico and in a programme at another university in compliance with the law. During the application process, applicants who are already enrolled at another university are required to enter the following information on the Apply@polito platform (EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND section): university, denomination and degree class of the programme, list of the exams included in the study plan (passed and unpassed) with number of credits, Scientific and Disciplinary Field and grade (if the exam has already been taken).
4. Applicants referred to in paragraphs 2 and 3 who wish to do a double enrolment are required to take the TIL-P test and be on the ranking list.

If the applicant is on the ranking list for admission to a programme at Politecnico, he/she must confirm his/her intention to enrol directly on the Apply@polito platform by paying the first instalment of the tuition fees (art. 14, paragraphs 1 and 2) before the deadlines, following the procedures for completing the enrolment process, which will be illustrated in the "Enrolment Regulations - A.Y. 2025/26" referred to in art. 14, paragraph 8. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process. After confirming the intention to enrol in the programme, the previous academic records of the applicant will be sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who will decide on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.
5. As per the "Procedures for entry, stay and enrolment in higher education programmes of students requiring visa - ay. 2024/2025" published at <https://www.universitaly.it/studenti-stranieri>, international students requiring visa are not allowed to enrol in two Bachelor's degree programmes in Year 1 (double enrolment) since the Universitaly portal only allows students to enrol in one programme at one Italian university.

**Art. 17
(Applicants currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme
and applicants with a university degree)**

1. **Applicants currently enrolled at Politecnico in a Bachelor's degree programme** who wish to transfer to the programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning must take and pass the TIL-P test. During the registration for the TIL-P test, they must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning in the "Select your programme" section of the Apply@polito platform. This choice cannot be modified.

If they **pass the TIL-P test and are on the ranking list** for admission, they must confirm their intention to enrol on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (art. 14, par. 1 and 2). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures



illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" referred to in art. 14, par. 8. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process.

2. **Students currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at another Italian university** who intend to enrol at Politecnico in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning **must take the TIL-P test** (also if they are attending a programme belonging to the same degree class) and conveniently place themselves on the ranking list. During the registration for the TIL-P test, they must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning in the "Select your programme" section of the Apply@polito platform. During the application process on the Apply@polito platform, these applicants must provide the details of their current Bachelor's studies university, denomination and degree class of the programme, list of the exams included in the study plan (passed and unpassed) with number of credits, Scientific and Disciplinary Field and grade (if the exam has already been taken).

If they are on the ranking list for admission, they must confirm their intention to transfer to Politecnico on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (14, par. 1 and 2). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" referred to in art. 14, par. 8. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process. After confirming their intention to enrol at Politecnico, the previous academic records of these applicants will be sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who will decide on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.

More information will be available in the Student Guide - a.y. 2025/26 (Transfers chapter – Transfers to Politecnico di Torino from another university). The Student Guide is going to be published in June.

3. **Applicants who are enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at another Italian university** and who wish to enrol also at Politecnico (double enrolment), must refer to the provisions of art. 16.
4. **Applicants who already have an Italian university degree** but are **not exempted from taking the TIL-P test** within the meaning of art. 13 must take the TIL-P test. If they pass it and are on the ranking list for admission, they must follow the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" (art. 14, par. 8). They must also comply with the terms and deadlines published in the Student Guide 2025/26 – Credit Transfer chapter – Credit transfer for Bachelor's degree programmes.
5. **Applicants with an Italian university degree**, must follow the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2025/26" (art. 14, par. 8). They must also comply with the terms and deadlines published in the Student Guide 2025/26 – Credit Transfer chapter – Credit transfer for Bachelor's degree programmes

Art. 18

(Students who are going to incur in forfeiture/ forfeited students)

1. The students currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at Politecnico di Torino who will incur in automatic forfeiture on 1st October 2025 and the students who forfeited in previous academic years are allowed to re-enrol in the same Bachelor's degree programme (if still offered) or in an equivalent programme without retaking the admission test. When specific national or Polito regulations impose a compulsory admission test this rule does not apply. The equivalence among degree programmes can be checked in this [table](https://www.istruzione.it/archivio/web/universita/equipollenze-titoli.html) of the Ministry of University and Research which compare educational qualifications (<https://www.istruzione.it/archivio/web/universita/equipollenze-titoli.html>).
2. If the Bachelor's degree programme from which students have forfeited is no longer offered by Politecnico, the students who wish to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning must register for the TIL-P test on the Apply@polito platform in compliance with the deadlines of art. 3,



par.1. They must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning in the "Select your programme" section. This choice cannot be modified.

3. The students who have forfeited from a Polito Bachelor's degree programme other than Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning who wish to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning must register for the TIL-P test on the Apply@polito platform in compliance with the deadlines of art. 3, par.1. They must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, urban, environmental and landscape planning in the "Select your programme" section. This choice cannot be modified.
4. More information will be available in the Student Guide a.y. 2025/26 ("Interruption, Suspension, Withdrawal, Forfeiture" chapter). The Student Guide is going to be published in June 2025.

In accordance with Rector's decree no. 258 of 22/03/2022, students with refugee status in Italy do not need an English and/or Italian language certificate for admission to Politecnico. They must in any case have the above-mentioned certificate/s in order to graduate. The language certificate must be presented before the registration deadline for the final examination.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- **High school diploma awarded after a period of at least 12 years of school attendance**
- **For applicants with high school diploma awarded after less than 12 years of school attendance:**

 - a. the applicant attended at least one school year at a high school in which the medium of instruction is Italian. In this case the school must specify that the medium of instruction is Italian;
 - b. the applicant has an Italian qualification (licenza elementare, licenza media, diploma di maturità or higher qualification);
 - c. the applicant has one of the qualifications listed in Annex 2 to the ["Procedures for entry, stay and enrolment of international students and the respective recognition of qualifications for higher education courses in Italy"](#) in compliance with the specifications indicated for each qualification with regard to Italian language requirements.
