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Preamble

1. This Call for applications regulates the admissions to the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning for academic year 2026/2027. The number of available student places is illustrated in Annex A.
2. Annexes A and B are integral parts of this Call.
3. Admission to the degree programmes may take place through:
 - a. taking an admission test called TIL-P (Test in Laib – Planning); or else,
 - b. submitting a SAT score, as described in art. 12.
4. Admissions to the Bachelor's degree programmes referred to in this article are subject to prior accreditation of the programmes themselves pursuant to current legislation.
5. The score obtained by the applicants in the TIL-P test is only valid for enrolment in academic year 2026/2027. For this reason, when applicants register for the TIL-P test, they must be attending their last year of high school (i.e. they should be getting their high school diploma in the summer of 2026 according to the Italian school calendar) or they must have already earned their high school diploma.
6. To take the TIL-P test, applicants must present a **valid and original identification document**; otherwise, they will not be allowed to sit the admission test. The following documents are considered valid:
 - a) identity card or passport
 - b) temporary replacement identity card with holder's photograph;
 - c) driver's licence (including the digital version uploaded to the IO app).
 Applicants who are unable to present one of the above-mentioned identification documents will not be allowed to take the test. They will have to register for a new test session, if available, and pay the registration fee again.

Art. 1

(Initiation of the procedure)

1. Applications are invited for admissions to the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning for a.y. 2026/27. Admissions are limited to the following number of student places:

2. For the purposes of admissions to the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning, the following categories have been given the following meaning:

European Union applicants: Italian citizens or other EU nationals;

Equivalent applicants:

 - applicants from Norway, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Switzerland and San Marino and the Holy See;
 - non-EU nationals legally residing in Italy with a valid residence permit for study, work or family reasons;
 - political refugees;
 - staff members of Foreign Diplomatic Missions (Embassies/Consulates) and International Organizations based in Italy, legally accredited to the Italian Government or to the Holy See (including family members: spouse and children);
3. Having considered the recent trends and the number of withdrawals which took place before 31st October in the latest academic years, the number of student places that can be assigned

for the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning could be higher than the number of places referred to in par.1.

4. Applicants can register for the admission test (art. 4 and 5) on the Apply@polito platform starting from **Thursday 22nd January 2026**.

Art. 2

(Admission requirements)

1. The requirements for admission to the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning are the following:
 - passing the admission test (TIL-P / Test in Laib – Planning) in accordance with the scores and the thresholds illustrated in art. 3, par. 1 and based on the ranking list referred to in art. 14, par. 1;
or else,
 - presenting a valid SAT score (art. 12) in accordance with the ranking list referred to in art. 14, par. 1;
2. In addition to the requirements referred to in par. 1, applicants must:
 - meet the enrolment requirements of Annex A "Requirements for enrolment in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning for a.y. 2026/27";
 - meet the specific requirements of Annex B "Specific requirements for UK, Scottish, US *high school diplomas and International Baccalaureate Diploma - a.y. 2026/27*".

Art. 3

(Guaranteed admission threshold and minimum admission threshold)

1. **Admission thresholds for applicants who take the TIL-P test:**
 - a) the **minimum threshold for being included in the ranking list** is **30/100**;
 - b) the **guaranteed admission threshold** is **60/100**. This score ensures automatic admission to the programme.
2. **SAT:** there is **not a guaranteed admission threshold** for the applicants who present a SAT score. Applicants must have a minimum score of 650 points in each of the two test sections (art.12, par.1). This score simply allows applicants to be included in the ranking list but does not ensure an offer of admission.

Art. 4

(How to register for the TIL-P test)

1. All applicants are required to register for the TIL-P test online on the Apply@polito platform. To complete their application, applicants are also required to pay the registration fee referred to in the next par. 2 and 3.
2. The TIL-P registration fee is € 50.00. The amount paid **cannot be reimbursed under any circumstances**, nor can it be considered valid for TIL-P sessions other than the one for which the applicant has registered.
3. The payment methods are the following:
 - a. credit cards (or other payment methods available on the PagoPA platform) generating **immediate payment and registration confirmation**;
 - b. pre-printed notice of payment (MAV on the PagoPA platform), generating a **deferred payment**. In this case the applicant's successful registration for the test will be confirmed after Politecnico receives the payment confirmation from its bank. If an applicant does not

pay by the deadline indicated in the notice of payment, the registration for the test will not be confirmed.

Art. 5

(TIL-P calendar and registration time frames)

1. **All applicants are required to take the TIL-P test in person at Politecnico.** There is a specific registration time frame for each test session. The following table illustrates the calendar of TIL-P tests delivered in the **computer labs (LAIB)** of the Torino main campus and of the Mondovì campus.
2. Applicants are allowed to register for a TIL-P session until all places are filled up. The last session is scheduled on **Monday 20th July 2026**.

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Other TIL-P tests will be delivered at the Politecnico HUB in Uzbekistan. Test dates and other practical details will be published on the website of Politecnico at:

4. **Applicants are allowed to take the TIL-P test for a maximum of 3 times totally, but only one time per session.** If an applicant takes the test more than once, **Politecnico will consider the highest score obtained** by the applicant in the various tests. Applicants are not allowed to cancel their registration from a test date after having registered for it.
5. **Applicants are not allowed to register for more than one test date at the same time.** They can register for a new test date exclusively after taking the test for which they had already registered.
6. If an applicant has already registered for a certain test date, the system will not allow the registration for an earlier test date.
7. Applicants are allowed to choose the time slot they prefer among the available time slots. After paying the registration fee, applicants will be able to see the exact location of the test (laib) on their personal page of the Apply@polito platform.

Art. 6

(How to register for and take the TIL-P test – applicants with disabilities or with Specific Learning Disorders)

1. In person TIL-P tests are organized in compliance with current legislation on disabilities and specific learning disorders. The procedures to take the TIL-P test for the applicants referred to in this par. are illustrated in the present Call. Applicants can request more information on the special arrangements provided to applicants with disabilities and specific learning disorders to the Special Needs Unit of Politecnico di Torino (<https://www.polito.it/en/education/services-and-life-at-politecnico/welcome-inclusion-and-support/inclusive-teaching>) by sending a ticket through the Ticketing Support System.
In particular, for organizational purposes:
 - applicants with disabilities or with an invalidity certificate (art. 16 of Law no.104/92) must present **a valid certificate issued by the local medical board specifying the type of disability and/or the level of invalidity** at least 15 days before the TIL-P test date.
 - applicants with disabilities or certified specific learning disorders (SpLD), referred to in Law no. 170/2010, must present **a valid certificate issued not later than 3 years ago (if the certificate was released before turning 18 years old) by the Italian Health Care System (SSN) or by a specialist or by a health care facility recognized by the Italian system.** The certificate must be presented at least 15 days before the TIL-P test date.
 - applicants with disabilities or specific learning disorders (SpLD) who reside abroad and intend to request special arrangements for the TIL-P test must present a certificate of disability or SpLD issued in their country. These documents must be official documents stamped by the issuing institution, signed by an official of the institution and written in one of the following languages: Italian, English, French, Spanish. For documents written in other languages, applicants must provide both the original document and its translation into Italian or English in a single file. The university bodies in charge of examining the above-mentioned certificates will verify if the foreign documents provide evidence of a disability or a SpLD accepted by Italian law.
2. Applicants with a valid certificate have the right to get extra time to complete the test (up to 30% extra time for applicants with SpLD, up to 50% extra time for applicants with disabilities) and are allowed to use a non-programmable calculator.
3. Applicants who need other kinds of arrangements (such as the help of a tutor to use the PC for applicants with visual impairment or with upper limb motor impairment, or the help of a sign language interpreter) must inform the Special Needs Unit by ticket with adequate prior notice

and in any case no later than 15 days before the test. Considering that organizing such special arrangements requires time, late requests may not be considered.

4. To make the TIL-P tests more accessible, applicants can make use of the "ReadSpeaker" to listen to the audio descriptions of the texts. Applicants are required to use their own devices (headphones with USB port). Applicants should also bring their own calculator.
5. Applicants referred to in this article must **upload their certificate of disability/ SpLD to the Apply@polito platform** ("PERSONAL INFORMATION" section) **no later than 15 days before the date of the TIL-P test**.
6. The Special Needs Unit of Politecnico di Torino will check the certificates which must comply with the requirements listed in par. 1. The outcome of this verification, in terms of whether the submitted documentation is valid or not, will be communicated exclusively through the Ticketing Support System of the Apply@polito platform.
Applicants are therefore strongly recommended to regularly check the tickets received on the Apply@polito platform after registering for the TIL-P test.

Art. 7 (TIL-P contents)

1. The TIL-P test is an individual test, available in Italian, which is different for each applicant. It is made up of automatically and randomly selected computer interface questions. All tests have an equivalent level of difficulty.
2. The TIL-P test consists of 42 questions, divided into 4 sections, with a predetermined number of questions to be finished within a pre-set time:
 - 12 Territory and Society questions in 24 minutes.
 - 12 Logical Reasoning and Mathematics questions in 30 minutes;
 - 6 Reading comprehension questions in 12 minutes;
 - 12 General knowledge questions in 24 minutes;

The total time for the TIL-P test is set at one hour and thirty minutes.

Each question has 5 possible answers marked with the letters A, B, C, D, E, only one of which is correct.

Art. 8 (TIL-P evaluation)

1. The result of each individual test is determined as follows:
 - 1 point for each correct answer
 - 0 points for each unanswered question
 - A penalty of 0.25 points (-0.25) for each incorrect question
2. The score is converted to hundredths and rounded up to the second decimal position.
At the end of the test, applicants will be able to see their score on the screen. Moreover, the test result will be available in the applicant personal page of the Apply@polito platform.
3. Applicants, including applicants admitted to Politecnico, who scored less than 3.6/12 in the Mathematics section (which corresponds to less than 30% of the maximum score for the section) will have to fulfil some supplementary academic obligations (in Italian, *Obblighi Formativi Aggiuntivi - OFA*). The Student Guide and the Teaching Regulations of each Bachelor's degree programme explain how students can fulfil their OFA.

Art. 9 (Cases in which the test is declared invalid)

1. During the test applicants must abide by the Code of Ethical Conduct and by the following conduct rules, otherwise the test may be declared invalid:
 - be absolutely silent during the test, except when they need to ask a question to test supervisor.

- exclusively make use of the blank sheets of paper and the pen/pencil provided by Supervision Committee.
 - it is forbidden to make use of personal materials such as sheets of paper, notebooks, notes, calculators, earphones or headphones (except for applicants entitled to extra time – art. 6), AI glasses or other materials including mobile phones and smartwatches which **must remain switched off** at all times and must be placed on the desk; moreover, in compliance with art. 13 of D.P.R. 487 of 1994, “if the mobile phone emits any kind of sound during the test (alarms, wake up alarms, vibrations or other), the applicant will be invited to leave the classroom and will be excluded from the selection process with no exceptions”.
2. If a test is declared invalid for infringement of the conduct rules referred to in the previous paragraph, the applicant is not entitled to any refund of the test registration fee.
 3. If a test is declared invalid due to the applicant's incorrect behaviour, the test will in any case count towards the three possible attempts.

Art. 10

(Progetto Orientamento Formativo)

1. Applicants who have taken part in the Project "Progetto Orientamento Formativo" and are eligible to take the admission test can choose to take it in one of the sessions listed in the table of art. 5. They can take advantage of the fee already paid for participating in the project.
2. If these applicants want to retake the TIL-P test, they are allowed to retake it 2 more times. In this case they must pay the registration fee in full (art. 4, par. 2). Politecnico will consider the **highest score** obtained by the applicant in all tests.
3. Applicants who are participating in the "Progetto Orientamento" must strictly abide by the general procedures illustrated in this Call.

Art. 11

(Exemptions from the TIL-P test)

1. The applicants who forfeited from studies or will incur in forfeiture (according to art. 20, par. 1) are exempted from taking the TIL-P test.

Art. 12

(SAT - Scholastic Assessment Test)

1. As an alternative to taking the TIL-P test, applicants can submit their SAT scores. Please note that submitting the SAT minimum scores indicated below does **not** guarantee an offer of admission to Politecnico.

Upon registration for the SAT test, applicants must ask the examination board (College Board) to automatically send the certificate to Politecnico di Torino (institution code: 7679)

2. From the opening date of the Apply@polito platform (art.1, par. 4) and no later than **Thursday 30th April 2026**, applicants are required to:
 - accurately **fill out** the "SAT SCORE" section of the Apply@polito platform by entering their SAT scores and all other requested data;
 - **submit their application** via the "SAVE AND SUBMIT" section;
 - **request that the examination board** (College Board) **send** the official results (Official Score Report) directly to Politecnico di Torino for the necessary checks.

Art. 13

(Guaranteed admission group, ranking list and updates of the ranking list)

1. The TIL-P results are made public through the publication of:
 - a) **the group of applicants who scored higher than or equal to the guaranteed admission threshold** (art. 3, par. 1). This score enables applicants to reserve *their student place/enrol* in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning. This list will be published after each TIL-P session. Successful applicants must reserve *their student place/enrol* **by Monday 31 August 2026 at 2.00 p.m.**, only after their test has been checked against irregularities by the Central Committee within three working days of the test date; if a test is declared invalid, the applicant will receive a mail (pec);
 - b) **a merit-based ranking list** for the allocation of residual student places (art. 14, par.1). This list includes all the applicants who scored higher than or equal to the minimum admission threshold as well as the applicants who presented a valid SAT score.
The ranking list will be published on Thursday 23rd July 2026.
2. The ranking list referred to in par. 1.b will be published in the online University Bulletin (Albo online) and/or on the university website in the "[Calls for applications, Regulations and Ranking lists](#)" section.
3. The "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2026-27" will illustrate the cases in which the applicants need to reserve *their student place* before enrolling. The "Enrolment regulations" will be published by **Tuesday 14th April 2026** (enrolment opening date) on the university website in the "[Calls for applications, Regulations and Ranking lists](#)" section.
4. **All applicants are strictly required to meet the deadlines illustrated in the table below. Failure to meet these deadlines entails permanent exclusion from the enrolment process:**

If necessary, there will be further updates of the ranking list. In any case, such updates will take place before the closing date of the ranking lists (art. 15, par. 2). In this case, the new deadlines will be published on the applicant's personal page of the Apply@polito platform.

5. Applicants are required to *reserve their student place/enrol* following an online procedure. At the same time, they must pay the **first instalment of their tuition fees**. The standard amount of the **first instalment is 161€**. Possible reductions or revisions of this amount will be announced in the Tuition Fee Regulations for academic year 2026/2027, which is going to be approved by the university bodies at a later date.
6. The procedure for *student place reservation/enrolment* referred to in the previous par. (including payment of the first instalment) must be completed also by the students who make a double enrolment in another university programme, in accordance with Law no. 33 of 12th April 2022.

Art. 14 (Ranking list)

1. The merit-based ranking list, along with all the subsequent updates and the new offers of admissions based on the actual number of *reserved student places* and completed enrolments—is drawn up according to the following **priority order**:
 - I. **Applicants who reached the guaranteed admission threshold in the TIL-P test**
Places are primarily allocated to the applicants who got a score equal to or higher than the guaranteed admission threshold in the TIL-P test, as defined in art. 3.1b).
 - II. **Applicants who presented a valid SAT score**
If, after the allocations described above, additional places remain available, new offers of admission will be made to the applicants who submitted a valid SAT score.
The ranking list is drawn up based on the applicants' SAT scores (taking into account the sum of the two scores obtained in the two SAT sections – “Math” and “Evidence-Based Reading and Writing”).
 - In the event of equal total scores, the position on the ranking list is determined by the score obtained by the applicants in each individual section, in the following order:
 - Math
 - Evidence-Based Reading and Writing
 - In the event of further equal rankings, the younger applicant will be given priority.
 - III. **Applicants who reached the minimum admission threshold in the TIL-P but did not reach the guaranteed admission threshold**
If, after the allocations described above, additional places remain available, new offers of admission will be made to the applicants who took the TIL-P test based on their TIL score.
 - In the event of equal TIL-P scores, the position on the ranking list is determined by the score obtained by the applicants in each individual section, in the following order:
 - Territory and Society
 - Logical Reasoning and Mathematics
 - Reading Comprehension
 - General Knowledge
 - In the event of further equal rankings, the younger applicant will be given priority.
2. The ranking list classifies prospective students into the following categories:

Art. 15

(How the ranking list is updated)

- The offers of admissions made to the applicants included in the ranking list are based on the updates of the ranking list which depend on the number of students who *reserve their place* and enrol online before the deadlines of art. 13, par.4.
The applicants included in the ranking list who are no longer interested in enrolling in the programme and **intend to renounce their right to be on the waiting list**, are kindly invited to communicate this decision to Politecnico through the Apply@polito platform; **when an applicant renounces his/her right to be on the waiting list, he/she irrevocably gives up his/her position on the ranking list**; therefore his/her student place is assigned to another applicant on the ranking list.
- The ranking list will be closed on **Tuesday 6th October 2026**.
Enrolment will no longer be possible after the closing date of the ranking lists.

Art. 16

(Enrolment requirements and process)

- The enrolment requirements are listed in Annex A and in Annex B.
- All applicants must meet the language requirements (listed in Annex A) by the following deadlines:**
 - Applicants with a non-Italian educational qualification:** by **Monday 20th July 2026**
 - Applicants with an Italian educational qualification:** by **Tuesday 30th September 2026**.

Before these deadlines, applicants are required to fill in the "LANGUAGE SKILLS" section of the Apply@polito platform entering the information on their Italian language certificate required for admission.
- Applicants who *reserved their student place* by the deadlines (Italian or non-Italian high school diploma) and who meet the language requirements (par. 2.a of the present article – applicants with a non-Italian educational qualification) must enrol online by **Wednesday 30th September 2026 at 2.00 p.m.** In the event of further updates of the ranking list and consequent new offers of admission, a new enrolment deadline will be announced and published on the applicant's personal page of the Apply@polito platform.
- Applicants who do not meet the deadlines of this article or the admission requirements listed in Annex A and/or Annex B** lose their right to enrol at Politecnico and will **not be entitled to ask for any refund of the first instalment of the tuition fees**, no matter the justification brought forward.
- The general instructions for enrolment** will be illustrated in the "*Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2026/27*" which are going to be published by **Tuesday 14th April 2026** (enrolment opening date).

Art. 17

(Applicants who take more than one admission test)

- Applicants who have taken more than one admission test for different Bachelor's degree programmes offered by Politecnico may be eligible for enrolment in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning and at the same time

they may be on a waiting list for other programmes (Engineering, Architecture, Design and Communication, and Industrial Manufacturing Technologies). In this case, they must reserve *their student place* or enrol in the programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning before the deadline - in order to avoid losing their place. Subsequently, if they find out that they have been admitted to another programme (Engineering, Architecture, Design and Communication, and Industrial Manufacturing Technologies) and they prefer to enrol in that programme, they will have to choose one of the following options using the online system:

- withdraw from the Bachelor's degree programme in which they enrolled ("withdrawal from studies"), following these steps:
 - a. fill out the request online available on their personal page of the Teaching Portal.
 - b. pay 16.00 Euro for the virtual revenue stamp required for the withdrawal (this amount must be paid from the personal page of the Teaching Portal).
 - c. enrol in the new Bachelor's degree programme after they receive the withdrawal confirmation (an e-mail confirming their withdrawal will be sent to their Polito mailbox). To enrol in the new programme, students must go to their personal page of the Teaching Portal and log in to the Apply@polito platform using the Student Number they received when they enrolled in the first programme.

- enrol in the new degree programme and declare on the Apply@polito platform that they also want to enrol in another programme (double enrolment) at Politecnico (see art.18). In both cases the process must be completed before the enrolment deadlines following the instructions provided in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2026/27".

2. Applicants who took the TIL-P test and are waiting for the results of the admission tests to other universities must enrol at Politecnico before the deadline - in order to avoid losing their place. Subsequently, if these applicants find out that they have been admitted to another university, they will be able to request a withdrawal/transfer, or declare that they want to enrol in both university programmes. In the event of withdrawal or transfer, **the tuition fees previously paid by these applicants will not be refunded under any circumstances.**

Art.18

(Double enrolment in two degree programmes)

1. Applicants who want to simultaneously enrol in two degree programmes must refer to the rules contained in Law no. 33 of 12th April 2022 and subsequent ministerial decrees (decree no. 930 of 29th July 2022 and no. 933 of 2nd August 2022) to verify if the two programmes are compatible for double enrolment.
2. Students are allowed to make a double enrolment in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning and in one of the programmes listed below, provided that 2/3 of the educational activities are different:
 - Architettura-Architecture
 - Design and Communication
 - Bachelor's degree programmes of the Engineering area, including the Professional Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Manufacturing Technologies
3. It is possible to simultaneously enrol in a degree programme at Politecnico and in a programme at another university in compliance with the law. During the application process, applicants who are already enrolled at another university are required to enter the following information on the Apply@polito platform ("EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND" section): university name, programme denomination and degree class, list of the exams included in the study plan (passed and pending) with number of credits, Scientific and Disciplinary Field and grade (if the exam has already been passed).
4. Applicants referred to in par. 2 and 3 who wish to do a double enrolment are required to take the TIL-P test and be on the ranking list. If the applicant is on the ranking list for admission to a programme at Politecnico, he/she must confirm his/her intention to enrol directly on the Apply@polito platform by paying the first instalment of the tuition fees (art. 13, par. 5 and 6) before the deadlines, following the procedures for completing the enrolment process, which

will be illustrated in the "Enrolment Regulations - A.Y. 2026/27" referred to in art. 16, par. 5. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process. After confirming the intention to enrol in the programme, the previous academic records of the applicant will be sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who will decide on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.

Art. 19

(Applicants currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme and applicants with a university degree)

1. **Applicants currently enrolled at Politecnico in a Bachelor's degree programme** who wish to transfer to the programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning must take and pass the TIL-P test. During the registration for the TIL-P test, they must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning in the "SELECT YOUR PROGRAMME" section of the Apply@polito platform. This choice cannot be modified.
If they **pass the TIL-P test and are on the ranking list** for admission, they must confirm their intention to enrol on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (art. 13, par. 5 and 6). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2026/27" referred to in art. 16, par. 5. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process.
2. **Students currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at another Italian university or graduates** who intend to enrol at Politecnico in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning **must take the TIL-P test** (also if they come from a programme belonging to the same degree class) and conveniently place themselves on the ranking list. During the registration for the TIL-P test, they must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning in the "SELECT YOUR PROGRAMME" section of the Apply@polito platform. During the application process on the Apply@polito platform, these applicants must provide the details of their current Bachelor's studies such as university name, denomination and degree class of the programme, list of the exams included in the study plan (passed and pending) with number of credits, Scientific and Disciplinary Field and grade (if the exam has already been passed).
If they are on the ranking list for admission, they must confirm their intention to transfer to Politecnico on the Apply@polito platform and pay the first instalment of their tuition fees (art. 13, par. 5 and 6). They must enrol in the programme following the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2026/27" referred to in art. 16, par. 5. Failure to comply with these terms entails permanent exclusion from the admission process. After confirming their intention to enrol at Politecnico, the previous academic records of these applicants will be sent to the Academic Advisor of the programme who will decide on the possible recognition of previously earned credits.
More information will be available in the Student Guide - a.y. 2026/27 ("Transfers" chapter – Transfers to Politecnico di Torino from another university). The Student Guide is going to be published in June 2026.
3. **Applicants enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme at another Italian university who wish to enrol also at Politecnico (double enrolment)**, must refer to the provisions of art. 18.
4. **Applicants with an Italian university degree**, must follow the procedures illustrated in the "Enrolment regulations – A.Y. 2026/27" (art. 16 par. 5). They must also comply with the terms and deadlines published in the Student Guide 2026/27 – "Credit Transfer" chapter – Credit transfer for Bachelor's degree programmes.

Art. 20

(Students who are going to incur in forfeiture/ forfeited students)

1. The students currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning at Politecnico di Torino who will incur in automatic

forfeiture on 1st October 2026 as well as the students who forfeited in previous academic years are allowed to re-enrol in the same Bachelor's degree programme (if still offered) or in an equivalent programme without retaking the admission test. The exemption from taking the admission test does not apply to the Bachelor's degree programmes that have a compulsory national admission test, such as the Bachelor's degree programme in Architettura-Architecture. The admission test is also compulsory for the Bachelor's degree programme in Industrial Production Engineering. The equivalence among degree programmes can be checked on the webpage of the Ministry of University and Research which compares educational qualifications: [Equipollenze ed equiparazioni tra titoli accademici italiani | Ministero dell'Università e della Ricerca](#).

2. The applicants who enrol in the programme without taking the admission test are required to submit their admission application through the Apply@polito platform by **13rd November 2026**. In this case, applicants need to select exclusively the Bachelor's degree programme from which they forfeited (or equivalent). These applicants are required to complete the enrolment process by **30th November 2026**.
3. The students - who have forfeited from a **Bachelor's degree programme** which **is no longer offered by Politecnico** - who wish enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning must register for the TIL-P test on the Apply@polito platform in compliance with the deadlines (art. 5, par.3). Applicants must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning from the "SELECT YOUR PROGRAMME" section following the instructions provided in art. 4. This choice cannot be modified.
4. The students - who have forfeited from a Polito Bachelor's degree programme other than Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning - who wish to enrol in the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning must register for the TIL-P test on the Apply@polito platform in compliance with the deadlines (art. 5, par.3). Applicants must select the Bachelor's degree programme in Territorial, Urban, Environmental and Landscape Planning in the "SELECT YOUR PROGRAMME" section following the instructions provided in art. 4. This choice cannot be modified.
5. More information will be available in the Student Guide a.y. 2026/27 ("Interruption, Suspension, Withdrawal, Forfeiture" chapter). The Student Guide is going to be published in June 2026.

Art. 21 (Offices and Ticketing)

3. Prof. Paolo Dabove and Mr. Luigi Rinaldi are appointed as members of the Central Committee for TIL tests referred to in the previous par..
4. Prof. Dario Daghero, Prof. Ursula Zich, and Mrs. Alessandra Berlese. are appointed as substitute members in the event of absence or incompatibility of a member of the Central Committee.
5. The members of the Lab Committees responsible for the practical implementation of the TIL tests will be appointed with the Rector's decree attached to this Call.

Art. 23

(Checks)

1. All declarations made by applicants while filling out the application form for TIL-P registration, as well as any supporting documents attached to the application form, may be checked and verified by Politecnico in accordance with D.P.R. no. 445/2000 (*Testo Unico delle disposizioni legislative e regolamentari in materia di documentazione amministrativa*).

Art. 24

(Privacy policy)

1. In accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (EU Regulation 2016/679 – GDPR) and the “Code on the protection of personal data” (D.R. no.196 of 30th June 2003 and further amendments), Politecnico di Torino (Data Controller) shall process applicants' personal data exclusively in pursuit of its institutional aims and for the transparency purposes imposed by the law. Personal data shall be processed in accordance with the principles of lawfulness, fairness and data minimization.

Art. 25

(Access to documents)

In accordance with Rector's decree no. 258 of 22/03/2022, students with refugee status in Italy do not need an English and/or Italian language certificate for admission to Politecnico. They must in any case have the above-mentioned certificate/s in order to graduate. The language certificate must be presented before registering for the final examination.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- **High school diploma awarded after a period of at least 12 years of school attendance**
- ***For applicants with high school diploma awarded after less than 12 years of school attendance:***

APPLICANTS WITH A NON-ITALIAN EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION WHO ARE EXEMPTED FROM PRESENTING AN ITALIAN LANGUAGE CERTIFICATE

The applicants who fall under any of the exemption cases listed below are required to declare it or upload the relevant statements before the deadlines illustrated in art. 16, par. 2 of this Call. Failure to comply will result in the loss of the right to enrol, as provided for in art. 16, par. 4.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB)

The International Baccalaureate Diploma, awarded after a period of 12 or 13 years of school attendance by a school that is recognized by the International Baccalaureate Organisation (IBO), is valid for admission to Politecnico Bachelor's degree programmes **IF** the applicants meet the following general requirements:

- at least 24 points earned in six optional subjects (of which 12 points must have been earned in subjects taken at "Higher Level")
- passing grade in the three core subjects: Theory of Knowledge (TOK), Creativity, Action, Service (CAS) and Extended Essay (EE).

Applicants must request that their school (IB Coordinator) share their IB Diploma through the official IBIS platform.
