APPENDIX

SCORE CALCULATION

1. Criteria for Master's degree programmes

The score for the students enrolled in a Master's degree programme is determined based on the following criteria:

- only the exam credits included in the Study Plan which count towards the achievement of the degree and are validated by Politecnico di Torino, are taken into consideration;
- exams passed by the applicants but not validated are not counted (i.e., following a transfer);
- Oversubscribed credits do not count towards the score (i.e., additional credits of *Percorso Intraprendenti*, Italian language credits for international students, traineeship extension credits, credits awarded following participation in special events/activities, etc.);
- in case of FULL TIME or PART-TIME enrolment for an entire academic year, the number of semesters of the career duration is set at 2;
- in case of an equal score on the ranking list, the older applicant priority will be given to the older applicant
- Politecnico di Torino takes into consideration the so called "integrated courses" (*corsi integrati*) exclusively if the student has taken all modules of the course, even if not registered in the transcript yet;
- pass-or-fail exams (exams without grade) are given the value of the average grade of other exams passed by the applicant up to the present.

Please note that for all courses/activities that can be recorded in the student transcript in a period of the year other than examination sessions (i.e., traineeship, external training activities...) Politecnico di Torino takes into consideration the actual registration date; therefore, if these activities are recorded after the date indicated in Annex A, they are not considered for the score.

Students with a particularly complex university career are invited to contact the International Mobility Unit through the Ticketing Support System when they submit their application (topic "MOBILITÀ OUTGOING – TESI SU PROPOSTA"). The ticket must be submitted at the same time as the application; tickets submitted after the deadline for applications or in a form other than that specified above will not be accepted for the purposes of calculating the score.

2. Score calculation – Master's degree programmes

The score is calculated by multiplying the number of credits for each passed exam by the grade obtained (for passed exams to which no grade has been awarded, the average grade of the passed exams to which a grade has been awarded is used). The sum of these products is then divided by the number of semesters that have passed since first enrolment.

If some credits are recognized following student forfeiture or withdrawal, the number of semesters is counted as specified in Section 2.1.

However, in the event of a transfer from another Italian university, semesters are counted from the date of first enrolment in the university system, even if the student did not get any exam validated or any credit transfer for the attainment of the degree.

The maximum number of credits used to calculate the score is 120 CFU, total number of credits required to earn the Master's degree.

For eligible applicants, the merit score will be calculated according to the following formula:

$$\text{Score} = \text{sum (Master's exam grade * CFU credit) / N. examination semesters}$$

In essence, the number of credits for each passed exam will be multiplied by the grade obtained; the sum of these products is divided by the number of semesters since the first enrolment in a Master's degree programme at any Italian or foreign university and then rounded up.

3. Definition of the scoring system for complex university

3.1 Course advanced from a Master's degree programme

The number of semesters in Master's degree programmes that provide for the recognition of 'advance credits' will be counted from the semester in which the first advance credit was included in the Annual Personal Study Plan, regardless of whether the exams were actually sat or passed.

3.2 Individual courses

In the event of enrolment on individual courses due to failure to meet the language requirement for enrolment on Master's degree programmes, where one or more courses from the first semester of the Master's programme are included, the semesters of such enrolment will be counted towards the score, regardless of whether the exams were actually sat or passed.

3.3 Calculation of the score in case of credit transfer (between degree programmes of the same level) and credits recognition after withdrawal, forfeiture and dual enrolment – career duration

In the event of credit transfer (between degree programmes of the same level) and in case of credit recognition after withdrawal, forfeiture and dual enrolment, the exams recorded in the study plan after their validation make the number of semesters increase (depending on the number of recognized credits) as shown in the table below:

RECOGNIZED CREDITS	ADDITIONAL SEMESTERS
1 - 30	1 semester
31 - 60	2 semesters
61 - 90	3 semesters
91 - 120	4 semesters
from 121	5 semesters

4. *Unregistered exams*

Applicants who are waiting for the registration of some exams¹ in their transcript when they submit their application must report this situation during the application phase using the **online** form that can be downloaded from the *Bando Tesi su proposta* website.

The following must be stated on the form:

- for exams taken during the mobility project: the number of credits of the corresponding exams provided in the study plan as set out in the last approved Learning Agreement;
- for exams passed at Politecnico di Torino that have not been registered in the transcript yet: course denomination, grade and exam date.

In particular, self-certifications will be accepted from:

- **Students whose mobility period has ended**, who have passed exams abroad by the dates specified in Annex A but have not yet had these validated by Politecnico by the same reference date. If the exams are recognised by the time the provisional ranking list is drawn up, the recorded mark will be taken into account. Otherwise, the credits for exams passed whilst on exchange and subject to self-certification will be awarded a mark out of thirty equal to the weighted average of the exams recorded in the student's academic record by the dates specified in Annex A.
- **Students whose mobility period has ended** and whose exams have been recognized: students who passed exams abroad by the dates specified in Annex A, having subsequently had these exams recognised by Politecnico. These exams will be taken into account when drawing up the provisional ranking list.
- **students who have passed exams at Politecnico di Torino** by the dates indicated in Annex A still waiting for the exam registration in the transcript by Politecnico by the same date.

¹ It should be noted that the term 'exams' refers to courses successfully completed, excluding the Internship, training activities outside the University or oversubscribed course (as referred to in article 1).
